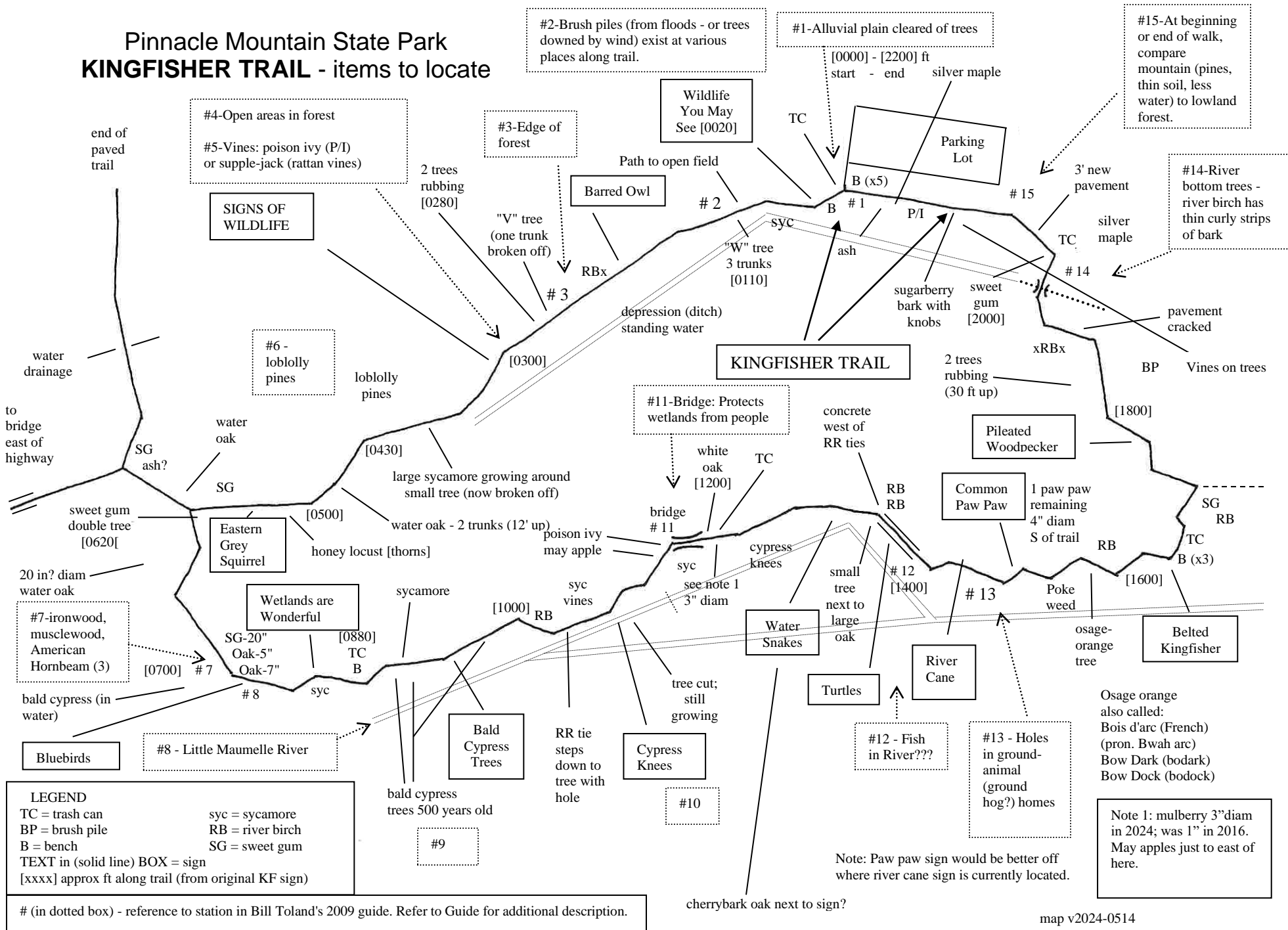


Pinnacle Mountain State Park KINGFISHER TRAIL - items to locate



#2-Brush piles (from floods - or trees downed by wind) exist at various places along trail.

#1-Alluvial plain cleared of trees
 [0000] - [2200] ft start - end silver maple

#15-At beginning or end of walk, compare mountain (pines, thin soil, less water) to lowland forest.

#4-Open areas in forest
 #5-Vines: poison ivy (P/I) or supple-jack (rattan vines)

#3-Edge of forest

#14-River bottom trees - river birch has thin curly strips of bark

#6 - loblolly pines

#11-Bridge: Protects wetlands from people
