

Rally for a Livable Future at the Bell Tower at the State Captial. On Friday January 13, Sierra Club and our partners in this climate war - Virginia League of Conservation Voters, Appalachian Voices and CCAN - hosted a Rally for a Livable Future at the Bell Tower to support and DEFEND existing environmental policy in the 2023 legislative session. Several Democratic House and Senate elected officials spoke and promised to fight efforts by the governor to drag Virginia backward by ignoring codified law and removing us from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) and Clean Cars standards. Joe Brancoli, FOJG Chair, was also at the rally. Here is his take on the event! On the beautiful sunny day of January 13th, a dozen legislators joined environmental minded citizens and community advocates on the Capitol grounds for the Rally for a Livable Future. Paige Wesselink of Sierra Club introduced speakers ranging in age from teens to octogenarians, from high schools to non-profits to the halls of the General Assembly. The theme of the day was expressed in many voices as one message: time is urgently short to take massive actions to cut emissions, cease exploitation of resources and preserve human and animal life on our shared planet.

Methane Gas monitoring. The FOJG has submitted a grant application for a methane monitoring device. If funded, FOJG and community groups aim to increase accountability of Richmond Gas Works by detecting gas leaks and compelling Richmond Gas Works to repair the leaks.

Electrify RVA Advocacy Group. Kevin Cianfarini continues to push for the city to implement the Solar App to expedite rooftop solar permitting in Richmond City.

Environmental Justice Actions! To decrease urban heat islands in Richmond City, we have advocated for an urban forestry position to help increase tree planting and maintenance of trees. <u>Urban Forestry position was posted over the holidays</u> and deadline is Jan. 31. Salary \$83,446.00 - \$133,293.00 annually.





3/14/2023 7:00 pm – 8:00 pm Virtual Program: The Importance of Habitat Connectivity and Protecting Virginia's Wildlife Corridors with Courtney Hayes Preserving habitat connectivity helps keep ecosystems healthy and intact. Specifically, preserving wildlife corridors, or connections between patches of important habitat, protects public health, reduces wildlife-vehicle collisions, allows wildlife to move to more suitable habitats, and makes our state more resilient in the face of a changing climate. We will discuss the importance of wildlife corridors, what work is being done to protect them in Virginia, and what work still needs to be done.
