Meet Recycle Livingston, the only non-profit, recycling center serving the residents of Livingston County and surrounding area since 1989. We are committed to reducing the flow of solid waste to local landfills today, even expanding our program to include many hard to recycle items.

Recycle Livingston is totally self-sustaining and receives no support from the State of Michigan or local governments. Since our beginning, we have relied on volunteer support so we can provide our services at a minimal cost and be available to everyone. We love our volunteers! If you commit to volunteering ten site days a year, you will receive a free yearly membership to Recycle Livingston.

Many of the items we accept are difficult and expensive to recycle and are not accepted at curbside programs; items such as Styrofoam, latex paint, household batteries, clothing, shoes, confidential document shredding, televisions, and much more!

Recycling is experiencing some tough and serious challenges but we all can help. To start we must do something as simple as changing how we view and talk about solid waste. We need to shift to a materials management planning process rather than disposal-only thinking.





Location: Huron Meadows Metropark, 8765 Hammel Rd, Brighton; meet at the Cedar Ridge picnic area parking lot **Skill Level**: beginner; **Difficulty**: easy to moderate; **Cost**: free, but requires Metropark entry fee Join us for a 5-mile or 3-mile hike through the diverse habitats of the Moraine Fen and other trails in the park.

Yoga on the Beach - Island Lake Recreation Area - Saturday September 21 and Sunday October 6, 9 AM**

Location: Island Lake Recreation Area, 6301 Kensington Rd, Brighton;

meet near the Kent Lake beach bathhouse building (go straight past toll booth, first lot on left)

Skill Level: beginner to advanced; *Difficulty*: easy to moderate; *Cost:* \$5, plus requires state park entry fee or passport. Join us for yoga on the beach. Welcome your day with relaxing poses, stretches and meditation. Bring your own mat (and optional towel to put under mat). All levels welcome. Led by an experienced yoga instructor.

meet in the Kent Lake parking lot (go straight past toll booth, first lot on left) near the boat launch area (west side)

Skill Level: beginner; *Difficulty*: easy to moderate; *Cost*: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport Join us for a 2.5-mile hike on the Hickory Ridge trail.

West River Trail Bike Ride with Cider Mill Stop - Sunday October 13, 1 PM**

Location: Hudson Mills Metropark - 8801 N Territorial Rd, Dexter; meet at the Activity Center parking lot **Skill Level**: beginner; **Difficulty**: easy to moderate; **Cost**: free, but requires Metropark entry fee Join us for an easy 12-mile pedal on the scenic, paved West River Trail from Hudson Mills to Dexter-Huron Metropark and back. We will stop for treats at the Dexter Cider Mill along the way.

Island Lake Fall Color Kayak/Canoe Paddle - Saturday October 19, 1 PM **

Location: Island Lake Recreation Area, 6301 Kensington Rd, Brighton;

meet in the Kent Lake parking lot (go straight past toll booth, first lot on left) at the boat launch area (west side)

Skill Level: any; Difficulty: easy to moderate

Cost: Optional boat rental/return transport fees listed below, plus state park entry fee or passport

Join us for a 3-mile or a 5.4-mile fall color paddle on the Huron River. The 3-mile paddle is 1 to 1.5 hours to the Riverbend picnic area; the 5.4 mile paddle is 2 to 3 hours to the Placeway Road takeout area.

Heavner is offering special rental rates for this event: \$15 for kayaks and \$20 for canoes. Return transport for people bringing own boat is \$5. Boat reservations suggested at www.heavnercanoe.com or 248-685-2379 (mention the "Fall Color Paddle").

Brighton Recreation Area Fall Color Hike - Sunday October 27, 1 PM**

Location: Bishop Lake trailhead parking lot, Howell;

From the intersection of Bishop Lake Rd and Chilson Rd in Howell, go east on Bishop Lake Rd 1.4 miles, turn right at Bishop Lake Complex sign then quick right after toll booth into trailhead parking lot. GPS: 42.5008,-83.8350 *Skill Level*: beginner; *Difficulty*: moderate; *Cost*: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport Join us for an afternoon hike to enjoy the beautiful fall colors on the Penosha Trail (5 miles) or the Kahchin trail (2

miles).

Kayaking/Canoeing for Cranes at Deerfield Hills - Saturday November 2, 5 PM**

Location: Deerfield Hills Nature Area, Green Rd & Cohoctah Rd, Fenton; meet in the parking lot. GPS: 42.764, -83.824 *Skill Level*: some experience; *Difficulty*: moderate; *Cost*: free

Join us for a kayak/canoe outing to the islands in Bennett Lake for some amazing views of hundreds of Sandhill cranes. The cranes gather in this migration staging area in preparation for their 1,000-mile southward journey. No boat rentals are available, must bring your own. Also bring binoculars, warm clothes (not cotton), and snacks.

Proud Lake State Recreation Area Hike Sunday November 10, 1 PM**

Location: Proud Lake Foot Path Trailhead, Commerce Twp; From I-96 & Wixom Rd, go north on Wixom Rd 7.2 miles, turn right on Park Headquarters Rd, go 0.2 miles, see trailhead parking lot on left. GPS: 42.5707, -83.5548 **Skill Level**: beginner; **Difficulty**: moderate; **Cost**: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport Join us for a 5.7-mile hike on the River Trail (with an option to break off early for a shorter hike). This scenic trail runs through a variety of landscapes including forests, marshlands, and parts of the Huron River.

Kensington Metropark Hike - Saturday November 23, 1 PM**

Location: Kensington Metropark, entrance is off Kensington Rd just north of I-96, Brighton; meet at the Nature Center **Skill Level**: beginner; **Difficulty**: easy to moderate; **Cost**: free, but requires Metropark entry fee Choose from a 5-mile or 2-mile hike around Wildwing Lake and other nature trails.

Black Friday #OptOutside Hike at Island Lake Recreation Area - Friday November 29, 1 PM**

Location: Island Lake Recreation Area, 6301 Kensington Rd, Brighton; meet in the Kent Lake parking lot (go straight past toll booth, first lot on left) near the boat launch area (west side) Skill Level: beginner; Difficulty: easy to moderate; Cost: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport Avoid the malls and #OptOutside(REI) on Black Friday with the Friends of Island Lake and Crossroads! This is a 5-mile hike (shorter options available) on the hikers-only Hickory Ridge trail.

Waterloo Recreation Area Hike - Sunday December 8, 1 PM**

Location: Gerald E. Eddy Discovery Center, 17030 Bush Rd, Chelsea

Skill Level: beginner; *Difficulty*: Easy to moderate; *Cost*: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport Join us for a 5-mile or 3-mile hike through some hills and forests with scenic lake views.

Highland State Recreation Area Hike - Saturday December 21, 1 PM**

Location: 5200 Highland Rd, White Lake;

meet at the trailhead parking area in front of the historic barn (follow main road from park entrance 1.4 miles).

Skill Level: beginner; Difficulty: moderate; Cost: free, but requires state park entry fee or passport

Join us for a 5-mile or a 2.5-mile hike through hardwoods and wetlands.

Huron Meadows Metropark Ski Outing/hike if no snow - Sunday December 29, 1 PM**

Location: Huron Meadows Metropark, 8765 Hammel Rd, Brighton; meet at the Ski/Golf Center

Skill Level: novices to advanced; *Difficulty*: easy to moderate; *Cost*: free, but requires Metropark entry fee. Optional ski rental \$15.

Join us for an afternoon cross country ski outing. Ski / boot rental available. Enjoy miles of groomed trails both on the golf course and through the woods. We will ski on shorter and longer distance trails depending on experience levels. We will hike if there is no snow.
