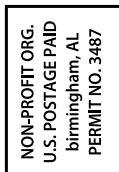

# Sierra Club Annual Retreat 2015

Come to the Alabama Chapter Retreat and participate in the Sierra Club's mission to "explore, enjoy, and protect the planet." There will be opportunities to explore and enjoy the Cahaba National Wildlife Refuge and other natural environments. You will hear educational presentations from environmental experts on how you can protect Alabama's waters, public lands, and wildlife as well as academics with vast knowledge of Alabama's geological history. You will be able to interact with other Chapter volunteers and discuss critical issues currently facing the state.

Living River – a retreat on the Cahaba – is located on 440 acres along the Cahaba River in Shelby and Bibb counties. Surrounded by the 2997 acre Cahaba National Wildlife Refuge, Living River offers hiking trails, canoeing, camping, and ample opportunity to view wildlife and the amazing biodiversity of the river.

Living River features camp lodging on site as well as a dining/meeting hall. Hotels and motels are also located within an hour's drive of the retreat.
