SAVE THE COOPER CREEK WATERSHED

In the spring of 2014, the Blue Ridge Ranger District of the Chattahoochee National Forest released problematic plans for the Cooper Creek Watershed Project. After the Forest Service released a draft Environmental Analysis (EA) at the end of 2015, we delivered thousands of written comments from concerned citizens to the Blue Ridge District.

This January, the District released a Final EA and Draft
Decision Notice on the Cooper Creek Project with a Finding of
No Significant Impact (FONSI). We do not agree that there
are no significant impacts to the environment with the
current proposal and submitted an administrative
objection in March with our partners Georgia ForestWatch and SELC.
