Do you work with rural electric cooperative members? You could be a potential Energy Democracy Fellow! Applications for the next iteration of the We Own It Network's Cooperative Energy Democracy Fellowship are now open.

The 2018-2019 fellowship will be expanding the program to 30 Fellows, and the program will still include relationship-focused team-building, coaching and campaign support, with direct financial support so that organizers can do what they do best. This fellowship is meant to skill-up organizing for reform in America's existing energy democracies -- our 860 rural electric cooperatives, which serve 42 million people in 47 states with a combined \$45 billion in revenue. It is also bringing together a network of local, on-the-ground organizations doing the pioneering work in this field.
