RE: Nebraska 2018 Legislative Session,

2018 Session Wrap Up

The Session

The 2018 session of the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature came to a close on April 18. As this was the second year of the two-year biennial, all bills not passed automatically died. Only 469 bills were introduced in this "short" 60 day session. As it turned out, that was more than enough to consider, as the body struggled to deal with just the individual Senator, Committee and Speaker priority bills.

The Legislature had one major responsibility and that was to fund a mid-biennium budget due to low revenue receipts. The University of Nebraska pushed back stronger than ever on cuts but, in the end, revised revenue projections from the Economic Forecasting Board helped alleviate some of the pain to the University and state agencies. Gov. Ricketts and the majority Republican legislature had made it clear the last two years that any sort of tax increase was off the table.

What's Next

The next regular session of the legislature will begin January 9, 2019.

More than 100 interim study resolutions have been offered for possible consideration between now and the end of the calendar year. Many of these will not be given time by the respective committee chair, but some will receive public hearings later this summer and in the fall. We will continue to pour through and identify all of potential interest to IIAN.

Two major initiatives are currently seeking enough signatures to appear on the November general election ballot. One would expand Medicaid and the other would offer a state income tax credit or refund on 50% of the property taxes paid toward education. The property tax measure is estimated as a \$1.1 billion annual expense to the state. If either of these measures are successful, it will make for some tough decision making in the 2019 legislature. All taxes, incentives and exemptions will be on the table.

With elections this November, the make up of the legislature will change next year. Half of the legislative districts are up for consideration. Six senators are barred from running again due to term limits, two chose not to seek reelection and two others are campaigning for a different office. This could change the leadership of the body next year and most certainly will have an impact on the constitution of the committees.

As was suspected would be the case, the 2018 edition of the Nebraska Legislature was not particularly productive. Even with a 100+ bill spurt on the last two days.

Sierra Club Bills

The Sierra Club was PRO on 15 bills; was ANTI on 3 bills, and merely monitoring 32 bills. Of the 15 PRO bills 2 passed (coordinate on ground water; black footed prairie dog) and 1 was withdrawn (KXL pipeline); the other 13 died. Of the 3 ANTI bills 2 passed (access to public power info; increase speed limit) and 1 died (stop wind power). Of the 32 merely monitor bills 10 passed, 1 was withdrawn, 1 was indefinitely postponed, and the other 20 died with the end of the session.

The following bills of interest to the Sierra Club have passed and now have the **Governor's signature**:

LB901 Bostelman M

Require Director of Aeronautics to consult with the Military Department in certain structure permitting decisions

LB1000E Briese M

Require a bond election under the Public Facilities Construction and Finance Act. 4/17/18 Signed by Governor. Emergency clause. Effective immediately.

LB1009 Murante Anti

Provide a super-two rural highway classification and change maximum highway speed limits as prescribed

LB1008E Bostelman Anti w/ Committee Amendments

Increase amounts of liquidated damages for certain violations of the Game Law LB1008 is now an Omnibus bill which incorporates AM2191 and AM2292 that killed LB822 (DNR coordinate with other agencies); as well as added LBs 713 and 761 (Oil & Gas Comm. \$400 per diem), and LB820 (procedure for PRB to grant

waiver for failure to notify PRB). 4/11/18 Signed by Governor. Emergency clause. Effective immediately.

On the final, 60th day, the Legislature passed on Final Reading and sent to the Governor for his signature:

LB449 Chambers SC PRO

Repeal the Black-Tailed Prairie Dog Management Act. Final Reading vote of 26 yes, 13 no, and 10 not voting.

TODAY:

The Governor has five days, excluding Sundays and holidays, to act upon legislation passed by the Unicameral Legislature (see, Constitution Art. IV, sec. XV). On Wednesday, April 18th, the 60th day of this just completed short session, the Legislature passed 24 bills. Today, April 23rd is that fifth day. 2018 bills become law effective on July 19, 2018, three calendar months after the Legislature adjourned; unless (1) the bill included a specific operative date, or (2) the bill included an emergency clause in which case that bill becomes effective the day after it was signed by the Governor.

If the Governor returns a bill to the Clerk of the Legislature without his signature (and with his objections), then the bill is vetoed; and, is subject to override by 3/5ths vote (i.e., 30 out of 49). Since the Legislature has adjourned sine die it cannot override any vetoes. Also, during the session, if the Governor holds a passed bill more than five days it becomes law without the Governor's signature. Since the Legislature has adjourned sine die the Governor can do a pocket veto by merely holding a bill for more than five days.

The Governor has returned all 24 bills to the Clerk of Legislature. Three of those 24 (LB449, LB873, LB998) were without his signature and with his objections; thus, vetoed.

Of interest to the Sierra Club, the Governor vetoed LB 449, Senator Chamber's Repeal the Black-Tailed Prairie Dog Management Act.

The bills the Governor vetoed were LB 873 (Urban Affairs Committee's catch all bill on local issues), LB 998 (Senator Walz's Create the Collaborative School Behavioral and Mental Health Program) and LB 449, Senator Chamber's Repeal the Black-Tailed Prairie Dog Management Act.

Between sessions the Legislature is still active with Interim Studies. We will be monitoring the list of Interim Studies which won't begin in earnest until late summer and early fall. <u>Please see</u> the final page of this report for a listing of ISRs of interest to the Sierra Club.
