Thirty organizations in Virginia were each awarded a Keep Virginia Beautiful (KVB) grant earlier this year. KVB had two grant categories – litter/beautification and single use plastic bag reduction. RGSC applied for the latter and was awarded \$750 to implement this campaign.

Ten Thousand Villages, a fair trade nonprofit store located in Central Park, partnered with RGSC for this grant. Kathy Rivers, store manager, provided volunteer power to help implement this project. (fyi, Ten Thousand Villages is moving to the Village at the Spotsylvania Towne Center in late September.)

The campaign, currently in progress, targeted three venues – a home improvement store (Lowe's at Central Park), a grocery store (Giant at Eagle Village) and a Farmers Market (Hurkamp Park). The Assistant Manager at Lowe's, Adam Moore, who already had a green consciousness, helped RGSC pull the project together. Lowe's was willing to match our purchase of 100 reusable bags, giving us a total of 200 bags to giveaway. An educational poster was displayed for 3 weeks before bags were given away on the weekend of June 30 and July 1 which is considered their last biggest sales weekend of the year. This was also the week of the hottest temperatures with the subsequent storms and power outages. The RGSC committee's goal was to encourage shoppers to bring reusable bags to all stores, not just grocery stores.

The first Saturday of August Farmer's Market at Hurkamp Park was the next targeted giveaway. Market Manager Gayle Price helped RGSC put out our educational poster every Saturday and Wednesday for a month prior to the August 4th Market and Family Table event. She added 35 reusable bags from Virginia Grown to add to our 200 reusable bags purchased from Giant. The goal was to encourage people to put their produce directly into the reusable bags rather than using the single use plastic bags and then placing the filled plastic bags into the reusable bag.

Giant matched our purchase of 300 reusable bags which will be given away during the weekdays and weekends in late August and in September. If you shop at Giant, check out our educational posters. One is displayed on an easel in front of the store and the second one is displayed on Giant's Green Team Communication board behind Customer Service. Store Manager Kenny Compher has been working on bringing green practices into the store and has been very accommodating.
