FRACKING East of I-95 -TAYLORSVILLE BASIN Citizens Stay Engaged

Its been two short years since RGSC offered informational meetings on the potential impacts of hydraulic fracturing east of I-95 in the Taylorsville Basin. Fracking leases have been signed in Caroline, King George, Westmoreland, Essex and King and Queen Counties. Local citizens, organizations and elected officials have held town hall meetings and educational sessions on fracking's potential impacts to aquifers, waterways, and agricultural land. Engaged citizens have raised valid concerns about methane migration, toxicity of fracking fluids, degradation of quality of life and property values as a result of the industrial activity of fracking. More questions and concerns raised include potential release of radioactive waste water (flowback), fracking induced earth quakes, and atmospheric release of methane (an "uber" greenhouse gas). The Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals, & Energy established a Regulatory Advisory Panel (RAP) to determine whether ingredients used in hydraulic fracturing should be disclosed, to review existing best practices, and to determine whether additional requirements are necessary for drilling in different regions of the Commonwealth.

The good news? No fracking permits have been issued in the Taylorsville Basin(yet) and engaged citizens want their elected officials to address their concerns. The RAP's next scheduled meeting is September 24, 2014 9 am at University of Mary Washington, Dalgren Campus, King George, VA. RAP website: http://www.dmme.virginia.gov/DGO/RegulatoryAction.shtml

RAP meetings are open to the public. Citizens are encouraged to remain engaged in this important issue.

Whats YOUR Next Adventure? A Lifetime Experience!

Adventure: "an undertaking usually involving danger and unknown risks; an exciting or remarkable experience."

We often think of an adventure as something that requires travel, great physical exertion, and some level of danger. Yes, an adventure can include all of that. This summer my husband and me, along with six fellow climbers and four guides, successfully sumitted Mt. Rainier. Located in Washington state, Mt. Rainier is a 14,411 ft glaciated active volcano that is subjected to rock slides, avalanches, large crevasses, and unpredictable weather.

According to the National Park Service, of the 10,000 climbers who attempt the summit, only half actually make it. Poor weather, altitude sickness, cold, exhaustion, and injury can cancel out ones best intentions to hit the peak. How well I understand. In September 2012, we trained for our first Mt. Rainier summit. We reached the Ingraham Glacier @ 11,000 ft, but had to retreat due to an injury . All of the time and energy invested in training and preparing for our summit could never be retrieved. Needless to say it was very disappointing and frustrating. But the experience and knowledge gained from that first attempt was priceless.

Whether its climbing a mountain or working to restore and maintain a clean healthy environment, we draw on our courage, strength, and perseverance to keep moving forward- sometimes one slow step at a time. We can accomplish truly amazing feats .
