The Autumn Assembly is a fun, family-friendly event featuring indoor and outdoor environmental activities for people of all ages.

Phantom Lake YMCA camp, founded in 1896, sits on 72 acres of scenic woodlands and offers a variety of opportunities for attendees to connect with nature. This year's Assembly, hosted by the Great Waters Group will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Wilderness Act and include updates on our campaigns to expand clean energy and transit and protect Wisconsin's water, land, and wildlife.
