A comprehensive, well-maintained transportation system is vital to our state and our local economies. To thrive

and grow, communities like La Crosse need good local roads, efficient transit service, and safe access for pedestrians and bicyclists. But state funding for local transportation needs has been declining for years and has resulted in deteriorating infrastructure, inadequate maintenance, and transit service cuts in all too many Wisconsin communities.

The Move Wisconsin Presentation will explore the challenges we face, delve into problems that have often been ignored, and lay out a road map for getting Wisconsin's transportation priorities straight.

Your opinion counts! Imagine borrowing a bicycle to pedal around La Crosse with a simple swipe of a credit card. Over the last year, The City of La Crosse, La Crosse Area Family YMCA and several partners have rallied to assess the possibility of bringing a bike-share program to the La Crosse Area.

Now the group needs your help! This 5-minute online survey (ending October 18) is one of many steps that are part of this bicycle-sharing feasibility study. https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/laxbikesharesurvey

Bike-sharing provides short-term use of a one-size fits all bicycles that are accessible in various docking stations at key locations throughout the city. A rider can pick up a bike in one location and return it conveniently to another location. Such programs already exist in places such as Madison, Milwaukee, and Minneapolis.


