Sierra Club's Goals in Wisconsin

**Presenter: Bill Davis, Chapter Director,
Sierra Club, John Muir Chapter**

Come meet Bill Davis, the new Chapter Director of Wisconsin's John Muir Chapter. Bill has Wildlife Ecology and Law degrees from the University of Wisconsin and was most recently a Senior Attorney for the Environmental Law and Policy Center.

Bill will introduce himself to the Coulee Group and present his vision for the John Muir Chapter in Wisconsin's challenging political climate. What are the goals of the Sierra Club in Wisconsin? How do we develop the power or clout to achieve them? Where do we apply the power and how do we measure success? What issues do we attack first and what's your role as a Sierra Club volunteer? Bill will leave plenty of time for the questions and discussion he hopes to generate.



To be or not to be; board members needed!

Our Executive Committee is discussing options for the future of the Coulee Region Sierra Club. Like many local non-profit groups, we're struggling for participation and relevance, while the number of local, national, and global environmental issues seems to grow daily. The seven current members of the Coulee Region ExCom have been in office from 5 to 13 years, and are looking for some new blood. We would like your input on where we go from here. That input can range from communicated comments to volunteering to join the ExCom and sharing the leadership.

We currently hold ten meetings per year with two (June and December) as social events. We organize the road clean-up three times a year and schedule an outing or two. We participate in issues, such as the Community Advisory Group for the DOT's La Crosse transportation study. We endorse candidates for office based on their record on environmental issues.

If we are to keep the same pace, we would need folks to step up and assist in the leadership. Options we're discussing

include going from 10 meetings per year to quarterly meetings. Other options are to suspend for a set time, or to "fold" (sending all money and responsibilities to the state chapter).
