Public Policy & Wildlife Management at Yellowstone Presenter: Jo Arney, Associate Professor, Political Science and Public Administration, University of Wisconsin-La Crosse

Managing our shared resources requires the ability to find shared values and create common ground. It is only by acting together as citizens that we can overcome the organizational and political challenges we face in being good stewards of the natural world. As part of this presentation, Ms. Arney will share stories and lessons gleaned from creating a Stewardship of Public Lands national blended course and faculty seminar for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. As part of this work, she speaks



with a variety of stakeholders regarding issues of disease control, wildlife management, and winter use of the land in and around Yellowstone National Park.

Jo Arney's main area of teaching and research interest is in environmental politics and policy. She is one of the lead scholars in the creation of a nationwide blended course about the stewardship of public lands being developed by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU). She is also the director of a stewardship of public lands AASCU course for faculty held in Yellowstone National Park each summer. Jo recently authored *Wilderness and the Common Good: A New Ethic of Citizenship*.
