OUTING: CAT POINT CREEK KAYAK TRIP SATURDAY, APRIL 1

A kayak trip to Cat Point Creek in the Northern Neck Peninsula is set for April 1. This trip will be 3½ to 4 hours long and begin at 9:00.

Cat Point Creek, starting at Menokin, is a winding, pristine creek which flows into the Rappahannock River. We will see osprey and eagles, as well as get information about the ecology, history, and conservation of the area from our guide, Richard Moncure, waterman and River Keeper with Friends of the Rappahannock group. Single and double kayaks and equipment will be provided by Virginia Outdoor Center.

OUTING: JAMES RIVER BALD EAGLE TOUR SUNDAY, APRIL 2

Bring your binoculars to view bald eagles -- and many other birds -- from a boat on the James River. The two-hour boat tour will focus on the resident bald eagles who live near Henricus Park throughout the year. The James River is the site of an amazing comeback of bald eagle populations -- from none 40 years ago to over 260 pairs in 2016. In addition you will surely see a myriad of other birds and wildlife, a testimony to the environmental riches of the James River.



On this two-hour eagle tour with other FOJG members, you will ride aboard the *Discovery Barge II*, a 24-foot covered pontoon boat. Two tours are from 7:00-9:00am and 9:30-11:30am. Each tour can take up to 6 people. Cost is \$50 per person. Tours depart from Deep Bottom Park in Varina at 9525 Deep Bottom Rd. If interested, contact Capt. 
