


RVA Environmental Film Festival Monday, Feb. 5 - Sunday, Feb. 18



Volunteering in the Bellemeade Community

Saturday morning, January 20, started out chilly but warmed up to beautiful sweater-weather as we participated in the Bellemeade Community Workday. The clean-up ended with good fellowship and pizza—and a promise to do it again!

The Falls of the James Group Sierra Club (FOJG) volunteers worked alongside community members—including kids--at the Bellemeade Community Center and Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary School in south Richmond. We removed invasive plants and vines from trees, cleaned up a pollinator garden, and helped maintain the creek and watershed.

Participating groups included Groundwork RVA high school students, middle school Green Team Students, Boy Scouts, RES.US, and Richmond Tree Stewards. Bob Argabright, the Groundwork RVA Board Chair, along with Daryl Downing, Vice-Chair of the State Chapter of the Sierra Club and FOJG advocacy committee chair, organized this event.

Groundwork RVA works with Richmond high school students to transform blighted and neglected open spaces into public assets, enhance the health of the James River, and maintain Richmond parks and schools in cooperation with the City of Richmond. Groundwork RVA students also work in conjunction with the U.S. National Park Service, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and Groundwork USA, Inc.

Bellemeade Community Center and Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary are two of twelve targeted sites by Groundwork RVA. Future plans for the Bellemeade Community Center include a trail, further watershed work, and expansion of a community bicycle repair shop. At the bike shop local children can learn about bicycle maintenance and have their bikes repaired in exchange for helping with community activities.

Sierra Club volunteers will be needed for future workdays in March through May, so stay tuned. Next workday is March 3. Hope to see you there!
