RVA Solar Fund is offering grants from \$4,000 to \$100,000 to public entities and nonprofit organizations.

Below is an extract from www.rvasolarfund.org/:

"Public-school systems, local governments, and 501(c)(3) charitable organizations in the Community Foundation's service area (the cities of Colonial Heights, Hopewell, Petersburg, and Richmond as well as the counties of Chesterfield, Goochland, Hanover, Henrico, and Powhatan) are invited to apply to the RVA Solar Fund. Additionally, K-12 public school districts and local governments from the counties of Amelia, Charles City, Cumberland, Dinwiddie, Essex, King and Queen, King William, New Kent, Prince George, Richmond, and Westmoreland also are eligible."

An Update on Richmond's Put Schools First Effort

As a result of last November's *Put School First* referendum which was supported by 85% of city voters, the mayor of Richmond must come up with a plan by January 1, 2019 to update the Richmond City Schools without raising taxes—or say it cannot be done. In the meantime, an extra 1½% tax imposed on city restaurants has enabled the city to borrow \$150 million for construction of three new schools—although not all the money has been earmarked for use by Richmond Public schools, as promised.

 The Falls of the James Group of the VA Sierra Club supported the *Put Schools First* effort with the hope that construction/renovation of the needed schools would incorporate solid green practices in their plans. Unexpectedly, there was a positive response from RVA Solar Fund which pledged \$100,000 to support a new Sustainability Associate position for RPS, the purchase and installation of energy monitoring systems, and an agreement with Secure Futures for installation of solar panels on a number of schools at no initial cost.

Editorial Comment on the Current Situation

Richmond school modernization now faces an additional uphill battle: the Mayor and other leaders who ran and were elected on 'Education' platforms continue to champion the Tom Farrell coliseum plan while ignoring the Put Schools First movement. No doubt, we will hear the same tired and false arguments about how Richmond needs to increase its tax base BEFORE modernizing schools. Don't fall for them. Take note of what has in recent years already been financed before school modernization: millions of dollars for the Redskins Training Camp, \$500,000 for studies of a Shockoe Bottom baseball stadium, \$500,000 for a current study of the Coliseum area development with a possible cost of millions more if the plan is approved by the City Council. Richmond citizens should take note of who proposes what. Also pay attention to what political candidates will eventually emerge to challenge the leaders who don't want to put schools first. Join the movement and keep up to date on current happenings.
