# Help Stop the Spectra Compressor Station & the Sabal Trail Pipeline

The threats posed by the Sabal Trail Pipeline caused the EPA to have objections to certain aspects of the proposed pipeline route. However, the agency reversed itself just last week after meeting with representatives of Sabal Trail Transmission LLC. And it's not just the pipeline that's a problem. To pump the liquefied natural gas through the pipeline, the company plans to build multiple noisy compressor stations, which would pollute the air in the area.

Fortunately, because Sabal Trail Transmission LLC moved its proposed Spectra Compressor Station site, it must acquire another air permit from the Georgia



Environmental Protection Division under the Clean Air Act. At least one of these would be built near hundreds of homes, two schools, and a church. With so many clean energy options, these risks simply aren't necessary. After public hearings in Albany, it is clear that the community does not want the compressor station, and without it, there will be no pipeline. Please take action today urging Governor Nathan Deal to instruct the EPD to reject the Sabal Trail pipeline's air permit!
