MARTA's Plan B



MARTA's hopes of securing a half-penny sales tax to fund an \$8 billion expansion seemed dismal after Georgia State Senators from North Fulton County and the mayors of John's Creek and Alpharetta worked to prevent SB 330 from getting a full hearing and vote by the Senate. Their proposal would expand the system northward to Alpharetta, eastward to Stonecrest, and to Emory University, and relies on state legislation before it can be put on the ballot for voters to approve in a November referendum.

Fortunately, MARTA's team is <u>pursing a Plan B</u> in the form of HB 1131, a bill that authorizes the Atlanta City Council to ask voters to approve the half-penny sales tax increase, specifically for improvements to MARTA inside city limits. A second local bill is expected for DeKalb County as well, effectively putting MARTA's plans to pursue the Connect 400 project on hold while the agency delivers projects to areas that support transit expansion most.

Still, the bill has to pass through both the House and the Senate before the end of the legislative session. Specifically, MARTOC Committe Chairman Tom Taylor and Sentor David Shafer, Senate President Tempore have the power to carry the bills to successful passage. In the past, these legislators have insisted that roads will solve our transportation problems--and we know that no amount of road building will provide the relief that will come when we invest in transportation choices like walking, biking, and public transit. Now, with just a few short weeks left, it is critical that they hear from you!

Please send a message to Senator Shafer and Representative Taylor in

support of expanding transit! Ask them to let the voters decide on funding MARTA at the ballot box.
