Georgia Giveaway for Pipeline Profits



As previously reported in Footnotes, the proposed Sabal Trail pipeline methane frack-gas pipeline that would run from northeast Alabama to south-central Florida. Multiple route choices exist; the company has chosen one, and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has approved the route that maximizes the taking of Georgian's private property under threat of eminent domain for private profit.

Even worse, the proposed route will run through miles of unstable karst terrain and sinkhole-prone areas resulting in a high danger of pipeline collapse, explosion, fire, and contamination of drinking water supplies. Sabal Trail's compressor station site is unjustly located in a populated African-American residential neighborhood and will pollute Dougherty County's air.

The FERC permit process is under appeal. The pipeline still does not have several major state and federal permits (water quality, air, and wetlands). **Yet the Deal Administration seeks to go ahead and give the project state easements under**

several major Georgia rivers, including the Chattahoochee, Flint, and Withlacoochee. Local legislators kept these easements out of the annual Senate Resolution to convey property easements (SR 954 this year, 2016), but pressure from the Governor's office had them inserted in the House Committee.

Urge your State Representative to vote "NO" on SR 954 unless the Sabal Trail easements are removed. Make sure they know their constituents oppose the taking of private property and our natural resources for the profit of a company based in Houston.
