

Act Now to Block the Sabal Trail Pipeline



As you know, the Houston-based energy company, Spectra, is maneuvering feverishly to push a 36-inch methane frack-gas pipeline across a huge swath of Georgia. This pipeline provides no benefit to Georgians, and puts our private property and our environment in jeopardy. Spectra Energy has a pitiful safety record, including two blowouts/explosions in the last 12 months: one in downtown Little Rock under the Arkansas River, and one just last month in Greensburg, Pennsylvania.

Act now! Urge Governor Deal to Block the Sabal Trail Methane Gas Pipeline by denying pipeline investors another key permit that they need.


Upcoming Events


