OUR GROWING MOUNTAIN OF TOXIC WASTE

We are still waiting to hear from Gov. Edgar & the IL EPA on our request for a full public hearing on the Peoria Disposal Co. request for modifications in its permit for operation of its hazardous waste landfill adjoining Lexington Hills subdivision on the west boundary of Peoria. Some more facts: PDC has asked the EPA for permits to 1) expand the landfill height of about 40 acres of its disposal area by 10-feet and 2) be allowed to accept a material that is part of the ash from toxic waste incinerators.

A 10-foot increase in depth over 40 acres amounts to a volume increase of 17,424,000 cubic feet. That would cover 33 football fields to a depth of 10 feet, and 33 football fields end to end would extend 2.3 miles.

The PCD landfill is reportedly already the 12th largest hazardous waste landfill of the 20 hazardous waste landfills in the nation. The 10-foot increase in height would evidently expand its capacity by 20 to 25%.

Hoth the Peo. City Council & the Land Use Comm. of the Peo. Cty Board have requested a public hearing at the urging of Sierra and PEACE. But its still in limbo. Write Gov. Edgar & local legislators C. Hawkinson, D. Leitch, & D. Saltsman. They're in the Peoria phone book. —Tom Edwards

GOING STRONG FOR THE RIVER--XNO BECKER MARINA

HoI Sierra's petitions protesting the 600-boat marina in lower Peoria Lake proposed by Ray Becker & the East Peoria City Council are going well.

And Hol's alternative proposalhas received virtually unanimous support from those familiar with it.

The Becker-E.P. marina as proposed would fill 15 acres of wetland, consumes 25-acres of the lake (which is public state property), and would extend a towering breakwater 900-feet into the lake.

Our alternative proposal would preserve and add to the lake and wetland-and would not require public financing, whereas the East Peoria proposal would spend millions of both state and local tax funds.

East Peoria's marina permit request to the Corps of Engineers, which we are opposing, still has not been acted on.

Other local groups, including the Peo. Ce Board are also active on this issue. - Tom Edwards

MOODFORD COUNTY LANDFILL EXPANSION FOR SOLID WASTE?

More than 100 people attended a Sept. 23 public meeting called to present a Woodford County Solid Waste Management Plan that was also accompanied by

a request of a Chicago firm for a 600-acre landfill at Minonk for Chicago waste.

A Minonk spokesman said, "We're here in solidarity against the landfill in Minonk. We're not here to give (the County Board) a hard time. We don't want (the landfill) and we want them to know how we feel."

Loop Recycling of Chicago said it would bring 1,000 tons a day of baled, compressed municipal waste -- about 50 semi-truckloads -- to the landfill it is proposing. The land proposed for this expansion is bounded by developed city property and sits on top of old sites of tunnel mines.


