### CONSERVATION 2000

Letters supporting the "original funding" initiative for Conservation 2000 are needed. This program would begin an attempt to protect our land and water resources as recommended by the Conservation Congress and the Water Resources and Land Use Priorities Task Force of 1993.

The proposed FY 95 budget would give **Agriculture** \$1,850,000 for conservation practices cost sharing, sustainable agriculture programs, soil and water conservation grants and streambank restoration.

Conservation would receive \$825,000 for financial incentives to private landowners, staffing and operations, greenways and macrosite plans and development/distribution of educational materials. The Division of Water Resources, IDOT would be budgeted \$125,000 to start studying the State's water law and to eventually overhaul and rewrite it.

Energy and Natural Resources would receive \$225,000 for ecosystem monitoring, coordinating council support and conservation and agriculture information networking. The Illinois EPA would receive \$500,00 for the Illinois Lake Management Program. Site M Development would receive \$2,500,000 and Conservation Easement Acquisition would be budgeted \$500,000.
