# Peoria Park Board Says No to the Pavilion in the Park

Hurray for the Peoria Park Board! This public body listens to the public.

At their October 13th regular meeting, Peoria Park Board members spoke to concerns about various aspects of the Pavilion in the Park, LLC. Board members also commented on the many postcards, emails, and calls they had received from members of the public opposing the Pavilion project. The pavilion group had withdrawn their application on October 5th but said they would return in 2022. The group proposed leasing 18 acres of

Donovan Park for a climate-controlled, open pavilion with seating for 1500 under the roof and seating for 500 outside, along with an estimated 650 car parking lot.

It should be clear to the Pavilion, LLC, that there is no reason they should return with their request in 2022. Thanks to all the HOI members who responded to email alerts, made phone calls, sent in comments, attended meetings, and assisted with yard signs. # CityLink Unveils New Electric Buses

CityLink unveiled three new Proterra battery-electric buses on September 8th in Peoria. One of the buses (pictured above) and the accompanying charging infrastructure was purchased as the result of a \$1.23 million grant from the Edwards Settlement Fund Distribution. The fund distribution, totaling \$8.6 million to benefit local area projects, was the result of a 2013 lawsuit filed by the Sierra Club, Natural Resources Defense Council and the Respiratory Health Association against the owners of the E.D. Edwards coal-fired power plant in Bartonville. The HOI Group participated in the grant selection process in early 2020 which selected CityLink as one of the recipients.

## Owner Fails to Address Local Concerns about the Edwards Coal Plant Ash Pond

#### Much Frustration with Illinois Power Resources Generating LLC Corporate Staff Presentation

Thirty-seven members of the public listened and asked questions of representatives from Illinois Power Resources Generating LLC, an affiliate of Vistra subsidiary Luminant, at the Pere Marquette Hotel, October 13th, during an evening session with poor microphone quality and responses from the corporation representatives that failed to satisfy local concerns. The meeting was to discuss the timeline, site activities, data collection, and additional measures to be taken with respect to evaluating closure of the coal ash impoundments at the site. The site has a 90 acre unlined coal combustion residuals (CCR) pond that is in Illinois River floodplain soils and an area with a high groundwater table.

Local concerns include that the toxic laden ash is in contact with the groundwater and that the ash should be removed to a state-of-the-art landfill with protective liners and monitoring, located away from the Illinois River. 
#### **Diane Jorgensen**
