Air Board Spending Vote Advances Heavy-Duty Electric Vehicles and Clean Air

SACRAMENTO–The California Air Resources Board (CARB) voted today to adopt a proposal for spending \$423 million of incentive money to substantially advance adoption of heavy-duty, zero-emission buses, trucks and tugboats.

The money is part of a \$1.2 billion the state received in a settlement agreement with Volkswagen following discovery of that the auto company cheated on emissions reporting on 85,000 diesel vehicles sold in California between 2009 and 2015.
