The fee was initially reduced to 10¢, then eliminated by Quiñones-Sánchez. Apparently the mayor will not sign a bill with a fee. Jim has been speaking with Maurice Sampson of Clean Water Action about the bill which has yet to come up for a vote to the full council.

John reported that 2 additional monitors have been installed at local churches in Chester City (Delaware County) to measure 2.5 particulate matter. The DEP plans to install a fancier monitor and has asked that ours be moved farther from the plant. Lou Ann Merkle is considering a monitor near the Covanta Plant in Plymouth.
