HOUSE FILE 775 BY ISENHART

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act prohibiting the manufacturing, distribution, and sale of
- 2 consumer products containing certain chemicals, including
- 3 effective date provisions, and making penalties applicable.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **455F.12 Upholstered furniture** —
- 2 flame retardant chemicals.
- 3 l. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise 4 requires:
- 5 a. "Flame-retardant chemical" means a chemical or chemical
- 6 compound for which a functional use is to resist or inhibit
- 7 the spread of fire. "Flame-retardant chemical" includes
- 8 halogenated, phosphorus-based, nitrogen-based, and nanoscale
- 9 flame retardants and any chemical or chemical compound for
- 10 which "flame retardant" appears on the substance safety data
- 11 sheet required under 29 C.F.R. §1910.1200(g).
- 12 b. "Upholstered furniture" means residential furniture
- 13 intended for indoor use in a home or dwelling unit and
- 14 consisting in whole or in part of resilient cushioning
- 15 materials enclosed within a covering that consists of fabric or
- 16 related materials.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided, a person shall not sell
- 18 or offer to sell or distribute for promotional purposes
- 19 upholstered furniture containing in its fabric or other
- 20 covering or in its cushioning materials more than one-tenth
- 21 of one percent of a flame-retardant chemical or more
- 22 than one-tenth of one percent of a mixture that includes
- 23 flame-retardant chemicals.
- 24 3. Subsection 2 does not apply to the following upholstered
- 25 furniture products containing flame-retardant chemicals:
- 26 a. Used upholstered furniture.
- 27 b. Upholstered furniture purchased for public use in public
- 28 facilities, including schools, jails, and hospitals, that meets
- 29 generally accepted flammability standards for seating furniture
- 30 used in public occupancies.
- 31 c. New upholstered furniture otherwise subject to
- 32 subsection 2 that is sold, offered for sale, or distributed for
- 33 promotional purposes in the state by a retailer or wholesaler
- 34 on or after January 1, 2020, and that was imported into the
- 35 state or otherwise purchased or acquired by the retailer or

- 1 wholesaler for sale or distribution in the state prior to
- 2 January 1, 2020.
- 3 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 455F.13 Food packaging fire
- 4 fighting foam fire fighting personal protective equipment —
- 5 perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances.
- 6 l. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise 7 requires:
- 8 a. "Class B fire fighting foam" means foam designed to
- 9 extinguish flammable-liquid fires.
- 10 b. "Fire fighting personal protective equipment" means
- 11 any clothing designed, intended, or marketed to be worn by
- 12 fire fighting personnel in the performance of their duties,
- 13 designed with the intent for use in fire and rescue activities,
- 14 including jackets, pants, shoes, gloves, helmets, and
- 15 respiratory equipment.
- 16 c. "Food packaging" means a package, including a unit
- 17 package, intermediate package, and a shipping container,
- 18 or packaging component, including any interior or exterior
- 19 blocking, bracing, cushioning, weatherproofing, exterior
- 20 strapping, coatings, closures, inks, and labels, that is
- 21 intended for the marketing, protection, or handling of a
- 22 product intended for food contact or used to store food for
- 23 sale.
- 24 d. "Perfluoroalkyl substance" or "polyfluoroalkyl substance"
- 25 means a class of fluorinated organic chemicals containing at
- 26 least one fully fluorinated carbon atom.
- 27 2. Except as otherwise provided, a person shall not
- 28 knowingly manufacture, sell, offer for sale, distribute for
- 29 sale, or distribute for use in this state food packaging,
- 30 class B fire fighting foam, or fire fighting personal
- 31 protective equipment to which a perfluoroalkyl substance or a
- 32 polyfluoroalkyl substance has been intentionally added in any
- 33 amount.
- 34 3. Subsection 2 does not apply to new food packaging, class
- 35 B fire fighting foam, or fire fighting personal protective

- 1 equipment that is sold, offered for sale, or distributed for
- 2 promotional purposes in the state by a retailer or wholesaler
- 3 on or after January 1, 2020, that was imported into the
- 4 state or otherwise purchased or acquired by the retailer or
- 5 wholesaler for sale or distribution in the state prior to
- 6 January 1, 2020.
- 7 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 455F.14 Class B fire fighting foam —
- 8 prohibition exceptions.
- 9 1. For purposes of this section, unless the context
- 10 otherwise requires:
- 11 a. "Class B fire fighting foam" means the same as defined
- 12 in section 455F.13.
- 13 b. "Local government" means a county, city, township, fire
- 14 district, or other special purpose district that provides fire
- 15 fighting services.
- 16 c. "Perfluoroalkyl substance" or "polyfluoroalkyl substance"
- 17 means the same as defined in section 455F.13.
- 18 d. "Terminal" means a fuel storage and distribution facility
- 19 that has been assigned a terminal control number by the federal
- 20 internal revenue service.
- 21 2. Beginning January 1, 2020, a person, local government,
- 22 or state agency shall not discharge or otherwise use for
- 23 training purposes a class B fire fighting foam that contains a
- 24 perfluoroalkyl substance or a polyfluoroalkyl substance that
- 25 was intentionally added.
- 3. Subsection 2 does not apply to the use, manufacture,
- 27 sale, or distribution of a class B fire fighting foam that
- 28 includes a perfluoroalkyl substance or a polyfluoroalkyl
- 29 substance that was intentionally added when the inclusion of
- 30 the perfluoroalkyl substance or a polyfluoroalkyl substance
- 31 is required by federal law. If an applicable federal law
- 32 allows the use of an alternative fire fighting agent that does
- 33 not contain a perfluoroalkyl substance or a polyfluoroalkyl
- 34 substance, the department of public health may adopt rules
- 35 that restrict the use, manufacture, sale, and distribution of

- 1 class B fire fighting foam for uses that are addressed by the 2 applicable federal law.
- Subsection 2 does not apply to the use, manufacture,
- 4 sale, or distribution of a class B fire fighting foam that
- 5 includes a perfluoroalkyl substance or a polyfluoroalkyl
- 6 substance that was intentionally added when the class B fire
- 7 fighting foam is used by a person operating a terminal.
- 8 Sec. 4. PERFLUOROALKYL AND POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES
- 9 ALTERNATIVES STUDY. The department of public health shall
- 10 conduct a one-year study of alternatives to perfluoroalkyl
- 11 and polyfluoroalkyl substances in food packaging. The
- 12 department shall assess the prevalence of perfluoroalkyl and
- 13 polyfluoroalkyl substances in food packaging and determine
- 14 the risks posed to consumers in the state. The department
- 15 shall identify safe alternative food packaging materials.
- 16 The department shall submit a report to the general assembly
- 17 detailing its findings and recommendations by December 31,
- 18 2020.
- 19 Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. The following take effect January
- 20 1, 2020:
- 21 The sections of this Act enacting sections 455F.12, 455F.13,
- 22 and 455F.14.
- 23 EXPLANATION
- 24 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 25 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 26 This bill relates to certain consumer products that contain
- 27 certain chemicals.
- The bill prohibits the sale of upholstered furniture that
- 29 contains flame-retardant chemicals or chemical compounds in the
- 30 state of Iowa. The bill makes exceptions for used upholstered
- 31 furniture, certain upholstered furniture purchased for public
- 32 use in public facilities, and new upholstered furniture that
- 33 is otherwise subject to the prohibition but was imported into
- 34 the state or otherwise purchased or acquired by a retailer
- 35 or wholesaler for sale or distribution in the state prior to

- 1 January 1, 2020.
- 2 The bill prohibits the sale of food packaging, class B fire
- 3 fighting foam, and fire fighting personal protective equipment
- 4 that contains perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances
- 5 in the state of Iowa. The bill makes an exception for new
- 6 food packaging, class B fire fighting foam, and fire fighting
- 7 personal protective equipment that is otherwise subject to
- 8 the prohibition but was imported into the state or otherwise
- 9 purchased or acquired by a retailer or wholesaler for sale or
- 10 distribution in the state prior to January 1, 2020.
- 11 The bill also prohibits a person, local government,
- 12 or state agency from discharging or otherwise using for
- 13 training purposes a class B fire fighting foam that contains
- 14 a perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substance that was
- 15 intentionally added, with certain exceptions.
- 16 The bill requires the department of public health to
- 17 conduct a one-year study investigating perfluoroalkyl and
- 18 polyfluoroalkyl substances in food packaging and finding safe
- 19 alternative food packaging materials. The department shall
- 20 submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the
- 21 general assembly by December 31, 2020.
- 22 A violation of the provisions in the bill is a simple
- 23 misdemeanor. The bill, except for the section requiring the
- 24 department of public health to conduct a study, takes effect
- 25 January 1, 2020.
- 26 A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no
- 27 more than 30 days or a fine of at least \$65 but not more than
- 28 \$625 or by both.
