Tampa Bay Group's Political Committee has been hard at work for you, vetting and recommending solid environmental candidates for endorsement by Sierra Club.

At the start of the election season we meet and review local, state and congressional races within our Group's boundaries, including races where districts overlap with neighboring Groups like Suncoast, Pasco, and Manatee-Sarasota. We look at the candidate's overall record and platform; their performance on environmental, equity, justice and inclusion issues. All endorsements must be vetted and approved by the Group's Executive Committee and a second voting tier, which varies depending on whether it is a local, state or congressional race. We are careful to comply with state and federal election laws, most of which apply to communications and contributions.



Hillsborough was the only county in the State to receive an "F" on the State of the Air report from the America Lung Association, 2018 - 2022. Brooke is also an active proponent of water protection, and the founder and facilitator of the Tampa Bay Climate Alliance. She was the state coordinator for Floridians Against Fracking and successfully got then-candidate Governor Ron DeSantis on record in support of a fracking ban. Brooke was also an adjunct law professor of advocacy at Fordham University.

Conservation Committee

The next meetings will be Monday, November 14 and Monday, December 12 at 6:30 via Zoom. The December meeting will review a previously recorded, very informative, slide presentation on contaminants in water.

- → Tampa PURE: The City requested and was denied additional funding for PURE. City Council requested that the over \$800,000 funding that they do have be spent on:
 - 1. Requesting on exemption from SB 64 to give them more time to plan,
 - 2. Answering Sierra Club's questions from March, 2022, and
- 3. Developing a water plan to use current water sources and explaining when more will be needed. **Tampa PURE and SB 64:** We are focusing on getting Tampa's discharge of wastewater into Tampa Bay be considered a beneficial use under SB 64 legislation. Sid Flannery has written a detailed paper on

be considered a beneficial use under SB 64 legislation. Sid Flannery has written a detailed paper on how the wastewater provides fresh (rather than salty) water to the Tampa Bay estuary and supports wildlife there. Getting this ruling would not prohibit other uses for the reclaimed water but would give time to consider specific needs and plan for additional water treatment on a case by case basis.

Tampa Water issues Going Forward: We hope to promote solutions that are good for the environment and citizens, such as water conservation and expanding reclaimed water to water lawns, which not only reduces drinking water use but also reduces the nutrient-rich reclaimed water going into the Bay.

- **→ Lawn-Free, Climate-Friendly Yards:** Caryle Cammisa is looking for volunteers to start an education program on water friendly yards.
- → Land Use: 12910 Boyette Road: there is a proposal for a land use change for a property next to the Gibbons Nature Preserve that is currently a golf driving range.

- Best Buy is now charging for single use bags at the checkout! Charging for single use products is the surest way to get the customer's attention and reduce single use plastic use. President Biden signed the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) into law on August 16, 2022.

Here Are the Top 10 Benefits¹

- 1. **30% tax credit on solar systems**. The solar Investment Tax Credit (ITC) means you get back nearly a third of the cost of your system if purchased between 2022 and 2032.
