January 9 Conservation Committee meeting will focus on infill and preventing sprawl.

<u>Stephen Benson</u> from City of Tampa and <u>Melissa Dickens</u> from Hillsborough County will discuss Comprehensive Plan updates, including infill and environment issues:

#### Water:

- → Tampa "PURE" this project name seems to be retired. City Council voted to have staff refer.to WASTEWATER REUSE in all correspondence so that the public can be aware of everything the city is doing.
- → SB64 legislation proposal: SB 64 has been used as an excuse to implement PURE which would cost Tampa water users Billions of dollars over 30 years
- → The request to FDEP to have the current wastewater discharge into Tampa Bay be ruled a beneficial reuse was denied. We are now seeking to get legislation to add language to the bill to give Tampa relief from rerouting all its wastewater at an enormous cost. Sid Flannery drafted language based on his document describing the benefits of the current wastewater discharge into Tampa Bay by adding fresh water into the estuary. We presented the proposal to city council, and plan to contact legislators.
- ★ <u>Conservation</u> **Caryle Cammisa** has started up a group to advocate for water friendly yards. Any who would like to join should contact Caryle. <u>ccammisa@gmail.com</u>

#### Land:

- → Bay Shore next to Tampa Garden Club: TA/CPA 22-13 requests a change in future land use from Residential-35 to Residential-83 to accommodate at 26 story tower and retain the Synagogue on the 2.1 acre site. The Planning Commission voted it inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan and it will go to Tampa City Council. Opposition includes Tampa Garden Club, Altura Towers, THAN, and T-TAG.
- ★ Ace Golf Development on Boyette: Development proposed next to Gibbons Preserve. We approved a letter developed by a land use attorney opposing it.

<u>Trees:</u> We expect the Tampa tree report to come out in February

- → Tampa Natural Resources Advisory Council: We sent a letter to Brian Knox, head of Natural Resources, asking about the tree fund of over \$2.5M and the plans on spending it to plant more trees. We will be meeting to discuss.
- → Tampa Infill Land Use: Lafayette Towers: Alison Date is reviewing a large development near Kennedy Blvd on an empty lot next to the Hillsborough River that currently contains a retention pond. Concern is the environmental impacts. Alison wrote a letter requesting the street trees be saved.

#### City of Tampa Municipal Elections -Renew your Vote by Mail request NOW

Once every 4 years, the City of Tampa holds its municipal elections, in March. This year, election day is March 7, but actually, that is the last day that you can vote in the election. But, first, you must be registered, so if you have not registered to vote, please contact the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections office and register no later than February 6, 2023.

Early voting starts on February 27 and runs until March 5. Hours for the polls during early voting are from 10 AM to 6 PM. During Early Voting, you can vote at any early voting site.

On March 7 (Election Day), the hours that the polls are open are 7 AM to 7 PM. You must vote in your assigned Precinct on Election Day.

You also have the option to vote by mail, but if you do so, you must request a vote by mail ballot no later than the  $10^{th}$  day before the election. To request a ballot call (813) 744-5900. You may receive a post card notice which gives an easy QR code to renew your vote by mail, or go to <a href="http://votehillsborough.gov/votebymail">http://votehillsborough.gov/votebymail</a> and select the "Vote By Mail" button.

Remember that vote by mail ballots must be received in the Supervisor of Elections office no later than election day. If in doubt as to whether it will be delivered in time, you can drop off your completed ballot at the Supervisor of Elections office.

All 7 of the City Council races are on the ballot, and the Mayoral election is happening once again. It is a non-partisan election. If there are multiple candidates in a race, and if the winning candidate does not receive more than 50% of the votes, there is a one-day run-off election on Tuesday, April 23, 2023.

The Tampa Bay Sierra Club's Political Committee will be busy evaluating the candidates' positions on environmental issues that are important to Sierra Club, and we will be issuing some endorsements of candidates as Election Day approaches. Our endorsement process is detailed and involves multiple levels of approval by the Committee, the Executive Committee and by a regional committee of political groups in neighboring counties.
