# Sierra Club Chapter Ex Com Meeting Minutes Feb. 11, 2023

Introduction - Kevin asked everyone to watch the recording of the recording of the Orientation Session.

#### Approved Minutes – passed unanimously

#### **Finance Report**

- Gretchen has been acting as treasurer as interim treasurer.
- December numbers have not been reported to chapters at the time of this report (2/8/23) so both income and expense numbers are not complete.
- Significantly exceeded 2022 budget net income of \$494,626 significantly, raising \$589,937 (nearly 20% more than we anticipated!)
- Additionally, we are currently \$50k under our anticipated expenses for 2022
- All 501c4 funds, donations and miscellaneous are accurate
- Doing better than anticipated by identifying new grants and spending down c3 reserves
- Salaries make up over 80% if budget, do not have end of the year numbers, so this expense will go up. Overall, expenses were lower than anticipated. Rent was \$10,000 less than expected due to moving
- Estimate we will be -\$50,000.
- National wants us to have at least 6 12 months reserve 501c4.

- Grants will be available from EPA and other agencies to combat climate change. For us to write
  a grant, we need to get permission from National in case other chapters are applying for the
  same grant. There is a process, but needs improvement. Policy Cannot apply for federal
  grants because we often sue the government.
- Fund raising has been down across all non-profits. Huge bump during Trump admin, knew it was a bump. Other considerations – high inflation, economic situation. harder and more expense to fund raise. National - on a hiring freeze until May. Chapter can only fill it Chapter can pay for it.
- National is not approving budget until May or June. But we have been promised our grants at 2022 level plus 5%. Gretchen feels budget is a minimum. Expecting guidance on pay equity and job descriptions. May result in pay increases based on duties.
- Budget for 2023 is a net positive, first time since the pandemic. This will bring us up to 5 months in reserve for 501c4, up from 2 3 months. Best practice is to have at least 6 months in reserve to maintain staff.

National is investing in Chapter funding/support for fund raising.

Salaries reflect a 4 - 5% increase. Also, accounts for hiring an admin person in July. Significant increase in staff travel. Consulting fees of \$4,000 to National for computer stuff. \$10,000 is for lobbyist. Increase for tabling supplies.

Call-out for someone that could design stickers! Or lapel pins. Print communications.

Motion to approve budget by Kevin, seconded by Helen. Budget approved unanimously.

## **Development Committee – Debbie Pratt**

## **Recent accomplishments or activities:**

#### **Overall:**

- Fund raising 2023 have to rely on staff and volunteer leaders.
- Three direct appeals via mail. March, August, November
- Action: Need volunteers to help stuff envelopes
- Action: Volunteer to draft a thank-you letter
- Three types of donors: Top, VIP, monthly will get thank-you notes
- Action: Call or email monthly donors that have lapsed.
- High school student is working 4 hours/week updating website

- Monthly recurring donations are up
  - The annual year-end appeal significantly outperformed 2021's. Impacts may have included:
    - o Using self-addressed stamped envelopes to large donors
    - Handwriting addresses
    - Sending thank you notes to large donors
    - Use of personalized, 50-year anniversary story (Caroline Pufalt)
  - Monthly giving is trending up, 30% higher between 2020 and 2022 totals.
  - With little exception, all MO Chapter Excom members are now contributors
