In a historic federal victory, President Biden and Secretary Granholm announced that the Department of Energy (DOE) is <u>stopping the approval of</u> <u>new liquified natural gas (LNG)</u> exports effective immediately! Here in Massachusetts, Boston announced that the <u>city's first networked geothermal</u> <u>heating system</u> will be constructed at the Franklin Field Apartments in Dorchester.

Both of these wins give us hope for tomorrow and reinforce that it's truly time to put gas in the past!


Have your energy bills been really high? Is it impacting your quality of life?

These stories can remain anonymous. We will be providing \$100 gift cards to compensate people for their stories and time.






Welcome Christine Pontes, new Chapter Treasurer!
