

It's August. The Planet is hot. You're hot. Everything is hot. But, rest assured, there's

no global warming (according to those shrill, public voices who shall not be named).

Despite my complaints about the heat, the talking heads, and the politicians, there is some fabulous news to report that will actually help all of us to beat the heat and reduce its effects around us!

We are beyond pleased and proud to report that our dear friends and fellow advocates from the grassroots group, **The Duncanville Nature Conservancy**, have won a year-long battle to have 42 acres of untouched creek, prairie, and forested property formally declared a nature preserve, and at the July City Council Meeting, the Duncanville City Council did just that! The Council voted to create the **Charles F. Ladd Nature Preserve**. It will be the city's first nature park and an asset to all who live there.If you'd like to learn more, an excellent article about the win has been published in GreenSource DFW and can be read **here**.

Additionally, those of us who were beyond saddened by the sale of the **Fairfield Lake State Park** to developers can take heart! The State Park (located approximately 95 miles South of downtown Dallas) which was purchased by Todd Interests (who is planning to develop the land into multi-million dollar homes) has had their plans dashed with the decision by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) who issued their decree to save the park via Eminent Domain on June 10th, 2023. In addition to the decision from the TPWD, we are cheering the work of our friends from the grassroots advocacy group, **Save Fairfield Lake State Park**, who
