Advocacy Hour: Protecting Our Night Skies

Stop the Project Maple Fracked Gas Expansion in Massachusetts!

It was just this past December when we celebrated the DPU decision in 20-80 that affirmed there is no future for gas in Mass. Yet, Enbridge has a proposed pipeline expansion, "Project Maple" that will put that future at risk, in addition to impacting already overburdened environmental justice communities in our state.

We need you to reach out to your local elected leaders and ask them to sign on and tell Governor Healey to Stop the Maple Fracked Gas Expansion in Massachusetts!

Clean Energy Victories



Every month is Earth month for us at Sierra Club, but this month we are celebrating some very exciting environmental victories!

- Project bids for new offshore wind development were submitted last week as part of a tri-state procurement process for future state-crossing offshore wind farms in MA, CT, and RI.
- The Biden Administration announced the approval of the nation's seventh commercial-scale offshore wind project, Sunrise

Wind. Sunrise Wind, which is expected to be operational in 2026, will be built off the coast of NY, RI, and MA, and will power more than 320,000 homes per year.

New England will be COAL-FREE by 2028! The region's last coalburning units in NH will retire by 2025 and 2028

Advocating for Energy Rebates

Last month, our Chapter circulated and submitted a sign on letter to the Department of Energy Resources (DOER), supported by 32 organizations, that calls for \$146 million in home energy rebates and incentives to be prioritized for low-income households and minority populations. This letter aims to strengthen the state's funding proposal by:

- Increasing transparency
- Removing subsidies toward fossil fuels or hybrid heating solutions
- Increasing renter protections
