
Stockton Earth Day

Probably the greatest thing about the eclipse of the sun on April 8, 2024 was that people of all colors, ages, education and political persuasions came together to witness the event.

B&P UFOs INVADE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA!

That's right; you heard right! Unidentified floating objects have come ashore on Southern California beaches. These little blue creatures have a natural built in sail and are called velella velella. They live on top of the open ocean. Velella is a marine organism that belongs to the phylum Cnidaria, which includes jellyfish, coral, and anemone.

They are less than 3 inches long with a flattened, oval-shaped deep blue disc as a base, and a thin translucent membrane rising out of the base that resembles a small sail. Velella are carnivores that feed on plankton. They are a food source for other marine organisms, including sea snails and sea slugs.



Velella are not dangerous to humans, however, it's a good idea to avoid touching your eyes or mouth, as their tentacles do have toxins and can cause skin and eye irritation.

Warning: The content of this article may be disturbing for some readers. Governor Gavin Newsom signed into law a bill that will allow human composting, a "green burial" option that is slowly gaining recognition. California is the fifth state to legalize the practice, following Colorado, Oregon, Vermont and Washington.


Under Assembly Bill 351, human composting will be allowed starting in 2027. The process involves placing human remains in a steel box with biodegradable materials, which help the body naturally decompose. That produces soil, which is given to family members, who may spread it or use it to grow plants.

Supporters of green burial options say that conventional burials put massive amounts of embalming fluid, steel and concrete into the ground. Cremations produce significant carbon emissions. Allowing bodies to decompose and return their nutrients to the organic cycle is a more appealing option for some environmentally conscious people.

Articles on this topic omitted comments for what to do with bones, teeth, knee replacements etc. The bill itself is a jumble of laws, contractual requirements and penalties if permits and licensing isn't properly followed. RIP.


B&P Meeting Schedule
