



2026 Legislative Scorecard and Report

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Colorado Sierra Club Legislative Committee and Staff

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Introduction

The 2026 Colorado Legislative Session was marked by several significant yet sometimes quiet victories for Colorado's environment. It included more wins to protect our state's lands, water, and resources than we have seen in several years, including big wins to defend coal retirement timelines. However, the 2026 session will likely be remembered for the critical issues facing our state that remain unaddressed and uphold an opportunity for leaders to take a stand in the future.

First among those outstanding concerns is the legislature's inability to pass much needed community protections and guardrails on the growth of AI-driven data centers that have been fast emerging across the state. As data centers continue to be constructed with very few limits, especially in low-income areas and among vulnerable populations, they threaten Colorado's energy usage and our water, now even more precious due to the continued drought. Sierra Club worked to pass Senate Bill 102 (SB 102) which would have implemented stricter limits on where data centers can be located, how they are powered, and how water is utilized and recycled. Unfortunately, this bill was postponed indefinitely in the last few days of session due to outside pressure from Big Tech companies.

On the opposing side, our organization actively opposed House Bill 1030 (HB 1030) which was also postponed indefinitely. This bill would have allowed data centers to continue to crop up in Colorado with additional tax incentives and zero community protections. Sierra Club will be looking to our elected leaders in 2027 to reopen this important issue and ensure that future data center construction in Colorado is done with community protections in mind.

Despite the challenges that we experienced with much needed data center legislation, our team especially wants to thank and congratulate State Senator Cathy Kipp for her leadership and sponsorship of SB102. Sen. Kipp was a true champion throughout this effort and knows that the state requires clear protections against the expansion of data centers. We're excited to work alongside her on this issue next session.

Other highlights of the 2026 legislative session include the state legislature's definitive push against the expansion of coal usage in Colorado through HB 1226. This legislation, championed by Senators Weissman and Cutter and Representatives Froelich and Willford, sets limits on coal plants that are operating beyond their scheduled retirement dates and provides the state with additional tools to address coal plants that are being forced to stay open by the Trump administration. The legislature also passed a comprehensive energy affordability bill (SB 002), expanded rooftop and balcony solar programs (HB 1225), and made road crossings safer for both drivers and Colorado wildlife (SB 141).

We look forward to going back to the legislature next year to address data centers, greenhouse gas reductions, protecting our state lands, and more. Next year will also be following a critical election and a new governor who we are eager to work with to protect Colorado's environment.

Scorecard Methodology

By the end of the 2026 Colorado Legislative Session, the Colorado Sierra Club tracked 73 bills with a success rate of 71% of the bills we supported, ultimately becoming law. Our legislative committee also had a 81% success rate of bills that we opposed failing to move forward.



The 2026 scorecard is calculated based on Colorado Sierra Club priority bills that received a vote on the house or senate floors. Each legislator is given a percentage based on how many of their votes aligned with our organization's stances.

This year's scorecard has been divided into conservation and energy scores, with each legislator receiving a different score based on their votes on various issues relating to conservation or energy policy.

You will find a list below of the top priority bills that the Colorado Sierra Club identified during the 2026 legislative session and the corresponding Energy and Conservation scores for each legislator.

PRIORITY LEGISLATION

CONSERVATION BILLS

HB 1132 - Practices to Support Pollinators (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Establishes a coordinated statewide effort in Colorado to increase pollinator habitats by prioritizing native plant use on state lands

HB 1323 (Committee Only) - Wildfire Resiliency Prohibiting Taking of Beavers (SUPPORT - FAILED)

Prohibits the recreational and commercial taking of beavers on Colorado public lands, with certain exceptions, to promote wildfire resiliency and ecosystem health.

HB 1342 - Negligently Luring Bears (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Establishes stricter penalties for knowingly luring black bears with food or edible waste, aiming to reduce human-bear conflicts and enhance public and wildlife safety.

SB 016 - Prohibit Discharge Preproduction Plastic Materials (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Prohibits the discharge of preproduction plastic materials from facilities into Colorado's waters or land to prevent plastic pollution and protect the environment

SB 062 - Rodenticide Use Restrictions (SUPPORT - FAILED)

Restricts the sale and use of certain rodenticides in Colorado to licensed professionals, mandates integrated pest management strategies, and aims to protect public health

SB 065 (Committee Only) - Systemic Insecticide Use Limitations (SUPPORT - FAILED)

Creates a certification and oversight program to restrict the use of systemic insecticide-treated field crop seeds in Colorado aimed at protecting pollinators, wildlife, and public health while supporting sustainable agriculture

SB 141 - Wildlife Collision Prevention (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Creates an optional \$5 fee during vehicle registration to fund wildlife crossing projects and related conservation efforts with the goal of reducing wildlife-vehicle collisions and improving habitat connectivity in Colorado

SJR 15 - Protecting Colorado's National Public Lands (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Affirms Colorado's commitment to protecting national public lands, opposes federal efforts to reduce public involvement or weaken key environmental laws, and urges state and federal leaders to defend public access and stewardship of these lands

ENERGY BILLS

HB 1007 - Improve Customer Use Distributed Energy Resources (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Streamlines the adoption of portable scale solar generation devices such as rooftop and balcony solar by removing regulatory barriers

HB 1013 - Ratio Utility Billing Systems (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Provides additional transparency to tenants on their utility bills and prevents landlords from addition unnecessary fees

HB 1225 - Distributed Energy Resources Requirements (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Increases needed grid interconnection, standardizes third-party upgrades, and improves how energy credits are allocated as more homeowners adopt solar energy alternatives

HB 1226 - Manage Emissions from Electric Generating Units (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Ensures state commitments to closing coal plants and that coal plants operating beyond retirement dates have pollution controls established

HB 1268 - Renewable Energy Development on Disturbed Lands (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Enables local governments to designate previously disturbed lands as Renewable Energy Reinvestment Areas, facilitating additional renewable energy development

HB 1326 - Sunset Public Utilities Commission (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Extends the Colorado Public Utilities Commission for 11 years and enacts additional reforms to modernize utility and transportation regulation and improve consumer protections

SB 002 - Energy Affordability (SUPPORT - PASSED)

Creates a statewide, income-based affordability program, capping utility bills as a percentage of income for qualifying Coloradans

SB 045 - Nuclear Workforce Development & Education Program (OPPOSED - FAILED)

Creates a council and grant program at the Colorado School of Mines to promote workforce development in the nuclear energy sector
