Dear Members of the Michigan Delegation,

We write to thank you for your continued work to address the COVID-19 crisis, the immediate health and human needs as well as the economic fallout. We strongly support your efforts to craft further COVID-19 legislative packages to ensure economic security and protect people's livelihoods. As you consider future legislation and stimulus opportunities, we ask that you prioritize specific policy support for clean energy workers and businesses, which are vital for making Michigan's economy more resilient and protecting public health.

Congress can help protect Michigan's 126,000 clean energy jobs and put your unemployed constituents back to work by enacting two key policy changes to support the clean energy sector in coming legislation:

- 1. Reinstate the Treasury Department's Section 1603 grant program to direct payments of existing tax credits for renewable energy, energy efficiency and storage projects directly to clean energy developers and suppliers now, rather than make them wait to claim these credits in tax filings. Between 2009-2017, this program contributed over \$3 million and helped develop over 200 clean energy projects in Michigan¹; and
- 2. Extend, expand, and update clean energy incentives for solar, onshore wind, storage, electric vehicles, and energy efficiency.

As mentioned above, there are over 126,000 jobs in the clean energy industry across Michigan and more broadly, there are 3.4 million clean energy workers in America². But the industry is being hit with delivery delays, forced employee absences, supply chain disruptions, financing challenges, project cancellations and postponements due to the COVID-19 crisis. We've already lost more 620,000 clean energy jobs across the country, and over 31,000 right here in Michigan during March, April, and May³.

Scientists recently confirmed that exposure to air pollution (especially PM 2.5 from coal plants) decreases the chance of surviving once contractracting Coronavirus, exacerbating the already dire threats facing communities in
