When it comes to energy and the environment, Donald Trump and his administration have attempted to boost the production of domestic oil, gas and coal by allowing oil, gas and coal companies to drill or mine in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge in Alaska and in many national public lands in the continental U.S. They withdrew the United States from the Paris Agreement, an international agreement meant to combat climate change. They have overturned President Obama’s rules that limited the amount of carbon emissions from power plants and vehicles, and have reduced government support for renewable energy like wind and solar. They have also rolled back E.P.A. regulations meant to limit air and water pollution, such as methane and mercury emissions.
