

Re: Arizona Voters Support Reforming the Filibuster

A new survey from Global Strategy Group, conducted in partnership with the Sierra Club, finds that Arizona voters support reforming the filibuster to allow the Senate to pass legislation to protect Americans' right to vote by simple majority.¹ Support for reforming the filibuster outweighs opposition by 15 points (56% support/41% support), with a plurality of Arizona voters (29%) *strongly* supporting filibuster reform.

Democrats and independent voters in the state support reforming the filibuster by double digits (+59 point margin among Democrats and +16 among independents), and more than a third of Republican voters (35%) also support filibuster reform. Support is strong among Hispanic voters (71% support/25% oppose), younger voters (62% support/33% oppose), and both college educated (56% support/41%) and non-college (56% support/40% oppose) voters in the state.

ABOUT THIS POLL:

Global Strategy Group conducted a telephone and online survey of 809 registered voters in Arizona from September 15th to September 20th, 2021. The survey had a margin of error of +/-3.4%. Care has been taken to ensure the geographic, political, and demographic divisions of the population of registered voters are properly represented.

¹ <u>Question text:</u> As you may know, the filibuster is a process in the U.S. Senate that allows a minority of U.S. senators to block legislation that a majority of senators support. Some people have proposed reforming the filibuster to allow the Senate to pass legislation that would protect American citizens' right to vote via a simple majority vote.
