## Catoctin (Blue) Trail Hike

Date: Saturday, September 26, 2015

Start time: 8:00 am

**Carpool meeting location:** 

Yellow Springs Elementary School 8717 Yellow Springs Road Frederick, MD 21702

GPS coordinates: 39.474415, -77.451933

We will meet at the first parking lot on your left after turning off of Yellow Springs Road to enter the school grounds.

**Hike description**: Join the Sierra Club on an 8.5 mile hike on one of the nicest sections of the Catoctin (Blue) Trail connecting the Frederick Municipal Watershed to Gambrill State Park. We will hike an outand-back route that descends from the Watershed into Clifford Hollow where the trail meanders along a gentle stream crossing it several times. While in the hollow, we will stop for lunch and a chance to relax in this peaceful streamside setting. This hike is rated on the more difficult side of moderate due to the length and a total elevation gain of 1200 feet. We will meet in the Yellow Springs Elementary School parking lot at 8:00 am and will leave promptly at 8:10 am to carpool to the trail head where the Catoctin Trail crosses Hamburg Road in the Watershed. The address and GPS coordinates of Yellow Springs Elementary are above. The hike will start by 8:30 am and should take about 4.5 hours to complete. Come on out and enjoy a lovely day in one of the hidden gems of the Frederick Watershed.

**To bring**: Please remember to bring at least one liter of water and a bag lunch or snacks. Please check the forecast ahead of time and wear layered clothing appropriate for the temperature and any precipitation that is expected.

# Help Plant Native Plants at Piney Run Nature Center on October 10, 2015

Students can earn service learning hours while helping to restore native plants to **Piney Run Nature Center**, 30 Martz Road, Sykesville MD 21784. On Saturday, October 10, starting at 10:00 am, students and adults will gather to plant perennials native to this

area of Maryland at a site where the Weed Warriors of Carroll County have cleared away invasive non-native weeds. Native plants are important because they support native wildlife.

We need people to dig and plant, people to carry water from the lake to the plants, and other various tasks. We did a similar planting at Bear Branch Nature Center in 2013, and with 100 volunteers it just took around 3 hours to complete the task. The Bear Branch site is thriving and beautiful.

This native plant restoration is sponsored by the Maryland Sierra Club (Catoctin Group), the Carroll County Forest Conservancy District Board, and the Carroll Master Gardeners. These volunteer groups will be there to help and will furnish tools and refreshments. If you have gardening gloves, we suggest you bring them along.

# Green Seed Farmers' Market: September 27

On Sunday, September 27, the **Sykesville Farmers' Market** (9 am - 2 pm) will be Going even Greener than it already is! In addition to offering its usual fare of locally produced fruits and vegetables, meat, eggs, dairy, homemade foods and crafts, the Market will feature two rows of eco-friendly vendors offering creatively repurposed and refurbished items to the public.

Some of the creative vendors at the Green Seed Farmers' Market will include:

**Green Earth Goods**—offering upcycled items made from cutting room scrap fabric

**Jenny Made It!**—offering upcycled furniture and household accessories **Button Down Times**—offering vintage recycled footstools and benches **Missy's Misfits**—offering repurposed clothing

**Deborah Pierzchalski**—offering primitive wood crafts, hand-painted signs on barn wood, upcycled mason jars

Troy's window screen art

**Waste Not! Carroll**—offering information about how to reduce, reuse and recycle items with an emphasis on the importance of zero waste to reduce our impact on climate change

The idea behind adding these special rows is to plant a "Green Seed" that will grow into a larger town-wide Green Fest in the Spring of 2016. The Sykesville Green Committee and the project team for the Green Seed Farmer's Market hope that this Green Seed event will generate excitement around all the possibilities of reducing, reusing and recycling with the ultimate goal of sending fewer items to the landfill.

The growing vision for a **Sykesville Green Fest** in the Spring of 2016 is to pattern it after the spectacular Boonsboro Green Fest which drew 5,000 people this year. In addition to over 200 eco-friendly vendors, the Boonsboro Green Fest included a swap shop where gently used sports equipment and clothing could be traded, a myriad of drive-thru collection stations where unwanted TV's, electronics, sneakers, bikes, flower pots, medicine bottles, plastic play equipment and much, much more could be dropped off to be repurposed/recycled, and a tent where speakers were scheduled to share tips about such topics as composting and planting trees. Of course music, fun, food and laughter would also be a part of a day designed to celebrate and help preserve our amazing earth!
