BILL DESCRIPTIONS AND VOTES

PUBLIC HEALTH

1. **HB 650, Doe Run Immunity:** HB 650 limits Doe Run's liability for lead poisoning caused by decades of negligent practices in lead mining and smelting operations in Missouri. Governor Nixon's veto overridden in House on September 11, 2013 by a vote of 110 to 50 and in the Senate by a vote of 26 to 8. **OPPOSE**

2. **HA9 to HB 881, Springfield Coal Ash Standards Exemption:** House Amendment 9 to HB 881 allows Springfield's City Utilities to ignore a ruling by DNR geologists that the proposed location for a new coal ash landfill was too risky, due to the likelihood of groundwater contamination. Passed in the House on April 23, 2013 by a vote of 89 to 61. **OPPOSE**

3. **HB 1430, Denial of Care:** Allows medical providers to deny reproductive health services and information about these services to patients based on the religious beliefs of the provider. Passed in the House on February 12, 2014 with a 116 to 38 vote. **OPPOSE**

4. **HB 1307, Anti-Women's Health:** Triples the time a woman must wait after an initial medical visit before she can receive an abortion. This extends the current 24 hour waiting period to 72 hours. Passed in the Senate on May 12, 2014 by a vote of 22 to 9. **OPPOSE**

ENERGY

5. **HB 44, Renewable Energy Standard:** In November 2008, voters passed Proposition C, the Clean Energy Initiative, requiring utility companies to increase their use of renewable energy to 15 percent by 2021. HB 44 weakened this initiative by allowing already existing hydro power to count as part of the 15 percent. Passed in the House on February 28, 2013 with a vote of 95-46. **OPPOSE**

6. **HB 1631, Weakening of Carbon Emissions Regulations:** This bill requires the Air Conservation Commission to develop emission standards through a unit-by-unit analysis of each existing source of carbon dioxide within the state, thereby making it more difficult to enforce EPA regulations designed to confront climate change. Passed in the Senate on May 5, 2014 by a vote of 23 to 7. Passed in the House on May 7, 2014 by a vote of 130 to 15. **OPPOSE**

7. **HCR 5, Keystone XL Pipeline:** This resolution urges Congress to support increased importation of Canadian tar sands as well as a swift approval of the Keystone XL tar sands pipeline. Passed in the House on March 10, 2014 by a vote of 134-14. Passed in the Senate on April 10, 2014 by a vote of 26-6. **OPPOSE**

LAND USE

8. **SB 265, Agenda 21:** This bill calls on the state and local government to avoid implementing policy

recommendations attributable to Agenda 21, the 1992 United Nations non-binding action plan to promote sustainable development. Passed in the Senate on April 4, 2013 with a vote of 24-9. Vetoed by Governor Nixon on May 2, 2013. The House failed to override the veto on September 11, 2013 by a vote of 107-53. **OPPOSE**

9. **HB 1201, Surface Mining Notification:** This bill requires that all potential surface mine operators send a notice of intent to landowners within a half mile of the proposed mine. If any of these landowners desire a public meeting, the meeting must be called at the expense of the mine operator. This legislation is especially significant due to the recent sand mining activity in Saint Francois and Sainte Genevieve Counties, where the sand will be used for fossil fuel extraction outside of the state through the method of hydraulic fracturing. Passed in the House on February 26, 2014 by a vote of 145 to 3. Passed in the Senate on April 29, 2014 by a vote of 32-0. **SUPPORT**

10. **HA 2 to HB 2006, Ozark National Scenic Riverways:** House Amendment 2 to HB 2006 called for the removal of \$6 million in the state budget for a state takeover of the Ozark National Scenic Riverways. A state takeover would get rid of Missouri's largest National Park and lead to decreased protections for the Current and Jacks Fork Rivers and surrounding land. HA 2 to HB 2006 failed in the House on March 25, 2014 by a vote of 108 to 45. The takeover funds were included in the final budget adopted by the general assembly. **SUPPORT**

11. **SCR 22, Ozark National Scenic Riverways:** SCR 22 calls for a state takeover and in absence of this takeover it urges the National Park Service to take no action on the problems confronting the Riverways. These ecosystems are being mismanaged through overdevelopment and overuse by ATVs and horses, causing erosion and E. coli contamination. Passed in the Senate by a vote of 23 to 8 on February 20, 2014. **OPPOSE**

VOTING RIGHTS

12. **HB 1073, Voter Suppression:** This bill requires a person to submit a specified form of photo identification in order to vote in a public election. While claiming to confront a form of voter fraud that is exceedingly rare, it would actually disqualify about 250,000 eligible voters from voting, with a disproportionate effect on low-income, minority and elderly citizens. Passed in the House on February 25, 2014 by a vote of 104 to 51. **OPPOSE**

13. **HJR 90, Early Voting Limitations:** Using language nullifying any other early voting law, this bill targets a citizens' ballot initiative that would grant early voting for up to six weeks by mail or in person. HJR 90 limits early voting to just 6 days, prohibits weekends, and limits the available times for voting to business hours. Passed in the Senate on May 12, 2014 by a vote of 22-8. Passed in the House on May 14, 2014 by a vote of 94 to 57. **OPPOSE**

METHODOLOGY

A “+” indicates a vote in support of the Sierra Club position, and a “-” indicates a vote against the Sierra Club position. In cases in which the legislator was absent or voted “present”, the vote was not included in the calculation. In cases in which the legislator had not yet been sworn in, had died, or resigned, the vote was labeled “not in house or senate” and was not included in the calculation.
