# **BILL DESCRIPTIONS AND VOTES**

- 1. SB 141 and HB 488– Prevents Local Governments From Creating Pro-Renewables, Anti-Fossil Fuel Policies: These bills diminish the ability of communities to control fossil fuel use. Specifically, they target building codes that favor electric over gas hookups for new buildings HB 488 passed the House on March 29, 2021 by a vote of 123 to 24 with 3 present. SB 141 passed the Senate on March 25, 2021. OPPOSE
- 2. HB 527 Attack on Wind Energy Infrastructure: This bill would take away the ability of the Grain Belt Express transmission line to utilize eminent domain to carry wind energy from Kansas to Missouri and states further east. It does not deal with eminent domain issues for any other entity. The transmission line has already been approved by the Public Service Commission. HCS HB 527 passed the House by a vote of 123 to 33 with 1 present on February 25, 2021. OPPOSE
- **3.** HB 697 Weakens Clean Energy Financing Program: The Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program gives low interest loans for energy efficiency and clean energy upgrades for homes. This bill would force administrators and contractors to clear unnecessary bureaucratic hurdles thereby diminishing the reach of the program. The amended version passed in the Senate and then passed in the House is not nearly as damaging to program, so only the original vote on the bill in its worst form is included here. HCS HB 697 passed the House by a vote of 103 to 48 on March 29, 2021. **OPPOSE**
- 4. HB 261 Nuclear CWIP: This bill would repeal Missouri's ban on charging ratepayers for construction work in in progress (CWIP), forcing ratepayers to take the risk of the potential construction of a new nuclear reactor, overturning a decision made by Missouri voters and setting up the state for the multibillion dollar boondoggles experienced by South Carolinians and Georgians. HB 261 passed the House by a vote of 107 to 46 on April 19, 2021. OPPOSE
- **5.** <u>SB 40 Attack on Environmental Standards</u>: This bill was a multi-pronged threat to environmental protection in Missouri. It would end vehicle emissions testing for St. Charles, Franklin and Jefferson Counties, which would harm air quality. In addition it would take away authority from environmental commissions to set permit fees, threatening the DNR budget. Furthermore, it would lower hazardous waste standards for the state. *SCS SB 40 passed the Senate by a vote of 23 to 10 on April 8, 2021*. **OPPOSE**
- 6. SCR 16 Condemning Biden for Not Giving Permit for Keystone XL Pipeline: This resolution condemns the president for correctly refusing a permit to TC Energy to create the Keystone XL pipeline, meant to facilitate transport of some of the most carbon intensive and dirtiest fuel on planet earth. SCR 16 passed the Senate on April 20, 2021 by a vote of 23 to 9. OPPOSE

- **7. HB 574 Weakens Protections from Factory Farms:** This bill bars county commissioners and local health boards from investigating complaints that CAFOs (factory farms) may have violated local health ordinances, making enforcing local health ordinances extremely difficult. This weakens protections for both health and water quality. It would also strictly limiting who may testify in a court proceeding against a CAFO. SS HCS HB 574 passed the Senate by a vote of 23 to 9 on January 29, 2021. It was truly agreed and finally passed in the House by a vote of 101 to 46 on May 4, 2021. **OPPOSE**
- **8. HB 2485 Turning Plastic into Fossil Fuel:** This bill waives solid waste disposal permitting requirements for firms that chemically transform plastic into fossil fuels and reconstituted plastic. The industry has a history of failure and environmental damage and has not been effective at turning plastic into new plastic. *HCS HB 2485 passed the House by a vote of 99 to 39 on April 4, 2022. SS SCS HCS HB 2485 passed the Senate by a vote of 21 to 11 on May 5, 2022.* **OPPOSE**
- **9. HB 1584 Electric Vehicle Charging Stations:** There is an urgent need to electrify transportation in Missouri because of climate change and air pollution. This bill would significantly limit the ability of local governments to implement electric vehicle charging station mandates. HCS HB 2587 passed the House by a vote of 108 to 35 on April 6, 2022. **OPPOSE**
- **10. HB 2587 Regulatory Sandbox Act:** This bill sets up a new government agency and a new commission to grant businesses exemptions from laws and regulations on a case by case bases. The structure could undermine the impartial rule of law and environmental regulations and encourage environmentally unsustainable practices such as cryptocurrency mining. *HB 1584 passed the House by a vote of 98 to 33 on March 10, 2022.* **OPPOSE**
- **11. HB 1734 and SB 756 Incentiviaztion of Overuse of Fossil Fuels:** These bills would give discounts to the largest consumers of energy from investor owned utilities, giving incentive for excess consumption of energy. *HCS HB 1734 passed the House by a vote of 100 to 42 on March 28, 2022. SB 756 passed the Senate on April 14 by a vote of 23 to 5. OPPOSE*
- **12. HB 1878 Undermining Voting Rights:** This bill undermines Missourians' right to vote and free and fair elections in Missouri. It does so by requiring an unconstitutional photo ID provision, implementing a phantom early voting provision, hindering voter registration drives, allowing the Secretary of State to order voters removed from the rolls and opening the door to sham audits. SS SCS HB 1878 passed the Senate by a vote of 23 to 11 on May, 9, 2022 and the House on May 12, 2022 by a vote of 97 to 47. **OPPOSE**
- **13. HB 1597 Selling Eleven Point State Park -**An amendment to this bill authorizes the sale of the entirety of beautiful Eleven Point State Park, pending the result of a court case. *HCS HB 1597 passed the House on April 6, 2022 by a vote of 94 to 46.* **OPPOSE**

### **METHODOLOGY**

A "+" indicates a vote in support of the Sierra Club position, and a "-" indicates a vote against the Sierra Club position. A "present" vote is counted as half positive and half negative. In cases in which the legislator was absent the vote was not included in the calculation. In cases in which the legislator had not yet been sworn in, had died, or resigned, the vote was labeled "not in house or senate" and was not included in the calculation.
