BILL DESCRIPTIONS AND VOTES

PUBLIC LANDS

1. **HB 1237 – Selling Off the Eleven Point State Park:**

This bill contained an amendment that would have forced the State of Missouri to auction off our Eleven Point State Park to private interests. *HS HB 1237 passed in the House by a vote of 106 to 43 on April 23, 2019. OPPOSE*

HAZARDOUS WASTE

2. **SCR 38 – Undermining the DNR’s Hazardous Waste Management Commission:**

This vote disapproves of the decision of the Department of Natural Resources’ Hazardous Waste Management Commission to increase fees on solid Hazardous Waste generators. *Passed the Senate on February 24, 2020 by a vote of 26 to 5 and passed the House on March 4, 2020 by a vote of 101 to 42. OPPOSE*

3. **SA 1 to SB 575 – Allowing Victims to Receive Compensation for Asbestos Poisoning:**

The underlying bill makes it harder to sue for and receive compensation for people damaged by asbestos. Senate Amendment 1 would make sure these restrictions on obtaining compensation do not apply to firefighters. *SA 1 to SS #2 for SB 575 failed in the Senate by a vote of 9 to 15 on February 25, 2020. SUPPORT*

FACTORY FARMS

4. **SB 391 – Banning Local Health Ordinances to Control Factory Farms:**

This bill prohibits counties from creating local health ordinances to control the negative effects caused by factory farms on human health and air and water quality. *SS SB 391 passed in the Senate by a vote of 23 to 11 on May 2, 2019 and in the House by a vote of 103 to 44 on May 14, 2019. OPPOSE*

CLIMATE CHANGE

5. HCS 43 – Condemns Green New Deal: This bill congressional Green New Deal proposal without offering any alternative vision for confronting catastrophic climate change. *HCS 43 passed the House on May 7, 2019 by a vote of 101 to 38. OPPOSE*

UTILITY POLICY

6. HB 2033 – Attack on Wind Energy Infrastructure: This bill would take away the ability of the Grain Belt Express transmission line to utilize eminent domain to carry wind energy from Kansas to Missouri and states further east. It does not deal with eminent domain issues for any other entity. The transmission line has already been approved by the PSC. *HCS HB 2033 passed the House by a vote of 118 to 42 on January 27, 2020. OPPOSE*

7. HB 215 – Weakens Clean Energy Financing Program: The Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program gives low interest loans for energy efficiency and clean energy upgrades for homes. This bill would force administrators and contractors to clear unnecessary bureaucratic hurdles thereby diminishing the reach of the program. *HCS HB 215 passed the House on May 9, 2019 by a vote of 99 to 42. OPPOSE*

8. SB 618 - Giving Incentives for Natural Gas: This bill gives greater leeway to gas utilities to charge customers for excess replacement of existing pipe with higher-capacity pipe - extending the life of dirty fossil fuel infrastructure over more environmentally friendly alternatives. *SS for SB 618 was third read and passed in the Senate on March 9, 2020 by a vote of 25 to 4. OPPOSE*

RIGHT TO PROTEST

9. HA 3 SCS SB 330 – Increased Penalties for “Critical Infrastructure” Disruption: The amendment creates increased penalties for trespassing and vandalism at protests against fossil fuel infrastructure, and makes organizations such as the Sierra Club potentially liable for the offenses of individuals. *House Amendment 3 to SCS SB was adopted in the House on May 15, 2019 by a vote of 101 to 42. OPPOSE*

REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS

10. HB 126 – Attack on Reproductive Rights: This bill bans the right to abortion after eight weeks of pregnancy and at the moment of conception if Roe v. Wade is overturned in the US Supreme Court. No exception is made for cases of rape or incest. The Sierra Club supports full access to family planning services in Missouri and worldwide. *SS SCS HB 126 passed in the Senate by a vote of 24 to 10 on May 15, 2019 and truly agreed and finally passed in the House by a vote of 110 to 44 on May 18, 2019. OPPOSE*

DEMOCRACY

11. SJR 38 – Undoing the Will of Missourians on Redistricting Reforms: This Joint Resolution forces a new vote looking to undo the changes chosen by Missourians in November 2018 to stop gerrymandering by having a non-partisan demographer create House and Senate district lines. *SS No.3 for SJR 38 passed the Senate on Feb 10, 2020 by a vote of 22 to 9. SS No 3 for SJR 38 was truly agreed and finally passed by the House on May 13, 2020. OPPOSE*

CORONAVIRUS RELIEF

12. HA 8 HB 2014 – Timely Action to Protect Missourians from COVID-19: This amendment to an emergency supplemental budget bill would have given Governor Parson access to \$87 million in emergency federal funds to buy ventilators and other needed medical supplies to protect Missourians from the emerging pandemic. *HA 8 to HCS HB 2014 failed the House on March 18, 2020 by a vote of 100 to 47. SUPPORT*

METHODOLOGY

A “+” indicates a vote in support of the Sierra Club position, and a “-” indicates a vote against the Sierra Club position. A “present” vote is counted as negative. In cases in which the legislator was absent the vote was not included in the calculation. In cases in which the legislator had not yet been sworn in, had died, or resigned, the vote was labeled “not in house or senate” and was not included in the calculation.
