
## Thank You, Guadalupe!

One city stepped up. Now it's our turn.



In the run-up to the California Coastal Commission's historic March 18 meeting, only one local government on the entire coast of California took a stand on the fate of the Oceano Dunes, and then got on the phone to tell the Commission about it.

That was the City of Guadalupe, which has had enough of bearing the brunt of the off-road playground's impacts on the environment and human health. The city council voted to protect the environment at the Oso Flaco Lake Natural Area by opposing State Parks' ill-conceived Public Works Plan to turn that beautiful region into an RV park while destroying 120 acres of prime ag and dune habitat. The City also voted to support the Coastal Commission staff recommendations to, among other things, phase out off-highway vehicle use of the Oceano Dunes and close the Pier Avenue entrance.

Now the Friends of Oso Flaco Lake, in partnership with the Sierra Club Santa Lucia Chapter and the Santa Maria Valley Community Foundation, is sponsoring a GoFundMe campaign to raise funds for the LeRoy Park and Community Center in Guadalupe.

It's a great project. LeRoy Park was once a vibrant social gathering place for residents of Guadalupe and beyond. But years have passed, and it really needs some work and attention. The City of Guadalupe has launched a Capital Campaign for \$1.5 million to supplement grant funds already received. We're hoping to raise \$25,000 toward that effort.
