



A new report from Physicians for Social Responsibility called "Hydrogen Pipe Dreams: why burning hydrogen in buildings is bad for climate and health" takes a close look at the health, safety, and climate impacts of blending hydrogen with methane in our gas system to fuel gas appliances in our homes. The report outlines several "failings" of this false climate solution as well as policy and advocacy recommendations, including pursuing electrification without delay.

Ask Your School District to Go Electric with the EPA's Clean

School Bus Funding Program

The EPA Clean School Bus Funding Program, the largest school bus funding program in U.S. history is now open for applications. This program will provide \$5 billion over the next five years (FY 2022-2026) to replace existing school buses with zero-emission and low-emission models. The current round makes available \$500 million in funding and allows school districts to apply for up to 25 buses. The EPA has put together a list of priority school districts that will receive a higher level of funding and preference in the selection process. The list of 24 priority school districts in Massachusetts is available here.

MBTA Bus Network Redesign

The MBTA is in the process of reimagining its bus network to better reflect the changes in travel patterns and create a better experience for riders. As a part of the redesign efforts, MBTA hopes to provide 25% more bus service, 70% more weekend service, and increase frequency of service. Use this <u>interactive map</u> to get detailed information on specific routes or use the <u>trip planning tool</u> to compare your current trip and the proposed redesigned bus network. Your input is critical to fine-tune and improve bus service. Tell the MBTA what you think about the proposed changes using the <u>online survey</u> or join one of the several <u>virtual or in-person public events</u> through June and July.

Support the Fair Share Amendment

The Fair Share Amendment is a proposal to amend the Massachusetts Constitution, creating an additional tax of four percentage points on a person's annual income above \$1 million. The revenue raised (approximately \$2b annually) would be spent on quality public education, public transportation, and maintenance of roads and bridges. The Fair Share Amendment will be on the ballot this November. Take action by signing this Vote Pledge Form and canvass friends and family to vote 'Yes' on Fair Share this November.
