
Interfaith Summit 2022

EPA Clean Trucks Rule Public Hearing

The EPA has announced its proposal to revise the clean truck standards. Trucks and buses make up only 10 percent of all vehicles on the road, but they disproportionately spew 45 percent of nitrogen oxide emissions and 57 percent of PM 2.5; and these are linked to childhood asthma, chronic illnesses, lung cancer, and premature death. EPA's standards are insufficient and need to be strengthened. We need to ensure the EPA sets a standard that reduces deadly NOx pollution 90% by 2027 and puts us on a path so that by 2035 all new trucks and buses are zero-emission.
