

Transportation Matters

Protect Regional Transit in the FY23 State Budget!

The 15 Regional Transit Authorities (RTAs) in Massachusetts serve 250 communities beyond the reach of the MBTA and are a lifeline for low-income families and essential workers. The RTAs rely significantly upon

funding in the annual state budget to support operations. In order for RTAs to maintain and improve service, and hire and train drivers to address the workforce shortage, they require \$101 million in FY23 operating funds.



Please call or email your Senator this week and ask them to co-sponsor Amendments #885 and #886 by Senator Harriette Chandler. That will make a total of \$103.5 million available to RTAs for service, workforce development and fare pilot programs.

Use this action guide from our friends at Massachusetts Public Health Association (MPHA) and T4MA to raise your voice:

- 1. Find your senator
- 2. If you know your Senator, <u>check if they have already co-sponsored amendments #885</u> & #886 here
- 3. If not, reach out to your Senator and ask them to co-sponsor Amendments #885 & #886 by Sen. Chandler. While calls have the most impact (see phone script), emails are great too (see email template)!
- 4. Post on social media using this toolkit, forward this email to your networks, or reach out to 2-3 close friends or colleagues and ask them to take action.
