

Webinar: Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT) Rule: The Road to Electrifying Trucks in Massachusetts

Massachusetts is considering adopting the Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT) Rule that, if adopted, will increase the percentage of clean, zero-emission trucks sold in Massachusetts leading to climate, health and economic benefits. Sierra Club, the Union of Concerned Scientists, and ACE held a webinar on why the ACT Rule is important, and how you can support the regulatory process to get the strongest possible rule. Environmental Protection Agency Finalizes Federal Rule, Strengthening Clean Car Standards

Today, the Environmental Protection Agency announced <u>its final rule</u> for federal clean car standards, which will curb emissions from the transportation sector and protect our health and our climate by strengthening the stringency for model years 2023 through 2026 for cars and light-duty trucks, including making important changes to improve on its initial proposal from August.

This final action follows months of advocacy from a diverse coalition of environmental, health, faith, and consumer organizations, after years of defending the Obama-era clean car standards from the previous administration's rollbacks. In September, over.200,000.people urged the Biden administration to strengthen the proposed rule and drop automaker loopholes in the final rule in order to act on climate action, racial justice, and public health. Additionally, 21 state attorneys.general, the District of Columbia, and six cities urged the EPA to strengthen its rule.
