








SF Estuary Partnership – Estuary Blueprint

- Regional management document required by the EPA (Technically called the Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan – CCMP)
- Created in 1993
- Updated in 2007, 2016, & right now
- 4 Goals
 32 Actions
 Over 80 partners
 Over 100 stakeholder groups informed the plan
 Updating in 5-year increments begging in 2016
 We are engaging Disadvantaged Communities and Tribal groups in this update.
- "Where do we want to be in 2050, and what do we need to do in the next 5 years to get there?"





Funding Programs that Reference the Estuary Blueprint

- SF Bay Water Quality
 Improvement Fund
 - Requires consistency with Blueprint
- Restore America's Estuaries –
 Coastal Watershed Grant
 - Letter of acknowledgement from local National Estuary Program (SFEP)

- Restoration Authority
 - Blueprint is one of the regional plans that can be referenced when applying for SFBRA Grants
- Speier's H.R. 610
 - "Projects, activities, and studies, including restoration projects and habitat improvement for fish, waterfowl, and wildlife, that advance the goals and objectives of the [Estuary Blueprint]"



Funding and
Implementing Nature
Based Solutions Requires
Partnerships
