October Monthly Meeting *Utah Redrock Wilderness* Wednesday, Oct 1, 7:30 PM North Star Middle School

Clayton Daughenbaugh will speak on *"Southern Utah Redrock Wilderness."* Clayton is the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance's (SUWA) Midwest Regional Coordinator. He holds several leadership and volunteer positions with the national Sierra Club including that of chair of the National Wildlands and Wilderness Team. Sierra Club works together with SUWA and two other organizational members as parts of the Utah Wilderness Coalition Executive Committee that coordinates the nationwide land protection campaign. A lot has happened since our CV Group was last updated by SUWA.

The wild places of southern Utah are the largest network of undesignated wilderness quality lands remaining in the lower 48 states and are under threat from widespread off-road vehicle damage and resource extraction, potentially including tar sands. The national campaign to protect them has long been a public lands priority of the Sierra Club. A portion of the area is currently a priority in the Club's national monument efforts

The program includes a 15 minute DVD narrated by Robert Redford which shows the land, the threats, and outlines the protection effort.
