General Meeting Program - December 11 7:00 pm - Refreshments at 6:30

We have two great programs for our last General Meeting of 2012. We know this is a busy time of year, but we hope you will make time to join us for this important meeting.

Protecting Texas by Moving Toward Safer, Cleaner Energy - and Away from Nuclear Power Karen Hadden will discuss nuclear energy and waste. Her talk will include discussion of Comanche Peak safety issues and how we can collectively address the issue of transport of radioactive waste through the D/FW area. Nuclear reactor waste is now being shipped to the Waste Control Specialists (WCS) radioactive waste dump in Andrews County in West Texas for burial.

Karen Hadden is a founder of Solar Austin and long-time solar advocate who advocates for energy efficiency and renewable energy, such as solar, geothermal, and wind power, as affordable energy choices that are available today. She is the executive director for Sustainable Energy and Economic Development (SEED) Coalition, and has been working for clean air and clean energy with the organization since 2000. Her organizing with friends and allies in San Antonio helped lead to CPS Energy halting their push for more nuclear reactors. Instead, they are pursuing 400 MW of solar power and showing the rest of the state how to go solar. Karen helped develop the Solar Si, Nuclear No campaign and continues to lead legal efforts to defeat four nuclear reactors proposed for the Comanche Peak and South Texas Project sites. She was deeply involved in the effort to defeat eight TXU coal plants in Texas and has helped create public awareness about the health effects of mercury and coal plant pollutants. She organized the Moms Against Mercury rally outside the Dallas EPA offices and the related public hearing, since EPA refused to hold one in Texas.

Water Conservation And Alternate Water Sources

The 2011 record drought exposed the weaknesses in water supply management in Texas. The large population growth and urbanization in North Central Texas exacerbated the problem for this area. Long term planning to avoid the recurrence of water shortages in this area requires a combination of water conservation practices and the seeking of new alternative sources of water supply. Alternative water supply options include rainwater harvesting, greywater, and air conditioner condensate reuse. Dr. Fouad Jaber will discuss conservation and design of alternative water sources.

Dr. Fouad Jaber is an assistant professor and integrated water resources management extension specialist with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension located at the Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center at Dallas. Dr. Jaber received his Ph.D. in Agricultural and Biological Engineering from Purdue University with emphasis in Natural and Environmental Resources Engineering. He also holds an M.S. degree in Irrigation, and a B.S. in agriculture from the American University of Beirut. His focus at the Dallas Center is that of conducting research and extension programs related to storm water management, stream restoration, non-point source pollution management from the urban environment, and water quality studies.
