Cedar Ridge Preserve

Cedar Ridge Preserve (formerly the Dallas Nature Center) is a slice of the hill country just 20 minutes from downtown Dallas. It is a natural habitat of 600 acres featuring 9 miles of trails, native trees, grasses and wildflowers, butterfly gardens, picnic areas, and wild mammals, birds, insects and reptiles. Ginger Bradley will tell us about some great opportunities that await you at Cedar Ridge Preserve.

Lewa Wildlife Conservancy

Twende Kenya: Conservation, Communities, Culture and Adventure in East Africa

Located northwest of Mt. Kenya, Lewa Wildlife Conservancy is a model of successful community based conservation in Africa. It also served as a catalyst for the development of the Northern Rangelands Trust, which is comprised of 19 communities who manage an area greater than 20,000 square kilometers (over 7,700 square miles). Lewa's community programs promote development and ensure security, access to clean water, healthcare and education of the neighboring communities in the value of wildlife. It is home to critically endangered species



including Black Rhino and Grevy's zebra. There are 440 species of birds and over 70 different mammals in Lewa's extremely diverse range of habitats. Each year, the American Association of Zookeepers (AAZK, Inc.) holds a national fundraising effort, Bowling for Rhinos (BFR). Donations support Lewa, the International Rhino Foundation and Action for Cheetahs in Kenya. Local chapters hold individual events with 100% of the donations being sent to these in situ conservation areas.

Linda King has led trips to Lewa and the surrounding area so that keepers, volunteers, friends and donors are able to see their the result of their efforts first hand. During her 23 years at the Dallas

Zoo, Linda has worked as a volunteer, keeper, senior keeper and currently supervisor of Zoo North Primates, Tigers and Otters. She graduated from Texas A&M University with a degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Science, focusing on Wildlife Biology. Linda has been involved in her professional association (AAZK, Inc.) at both the local chapter level and serving four years on the national Board of Directors. Linda's volunteer job as a zoo group trip leader is the perfect marriage of her passion for travel and wildlife conservation, and she looks forward to sharing that with as many people as possible.

Memorial Day Bus Trip to Bandelier National Monument in New Mexico

Backpacking and day hikes from the campground - this promises to be a Memorial Day weekend to remember! This scenic and historic destination we love so much experienced a fire just after our 2011 visit. Now the trails have reopened and it's time to go back and explore this beautiful area northwest of Santa Fe, NM. Trip options have been designed for backpackers and campers of all skill levels. In addition to backpacking options, this year we're excited to also offer a base camp with day hikes from the Ponderosa campground and the Juniper campground! Everyone on this trip will have time to learn about Native

Fourth of July Bus Trip to the Sangre de Cristo Wilderness in Colorado

Plan an extended Fourth of July weekend of backpacking in the Sangre de Cristo Wilderness Area, a protected part of the San Isabel National Forest since 1993, near Westcliffe, Colorado. The spine of this northsouth mountain chain is typically near 12,000 feet, with peaks of more than 14,000 feet. After



breakfast in Westcliffe, participants in four groups will explore the foothills, high valleys and crests. Destinations include Venable Falls, the Goodwin Lakes, Phantom Terrace, Comanche Lake, Music Pass and the Sand Creek Basin of Great Sand Dunes National Preserve. Daily mileages for all groups will be short, but altitude and daily climbs (9,000 to 11,700 feet sleeping elevations and climbs of 1,500 feet on at least one day for each group) make one previous overnight backpacking trip a requirement. <u>Click here for trip details and registration forms.</u>
